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SOICHIRO SCHIMIZU, the claimant herein, being first duly sworn, testified through the interpreter as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. BEST:

Q. Is that your signature? A. Yes.

Q. Is that your signature? A. Yes.

Q. And is that your signature?

A. Yes.

Q. Were these forms prepared upon your instructions? A. Yes.

Q. And do you swear the contents of them are true? A. Yes.

(THREE PERSONAL CHATTELS CLAIM FORMS,
MARKED EXHIBIT NQ1)

MR. CHRISTIE: I tender as Exhibit 2 the Analysis of Personal Property Claim.

Q. I understand prior to your evacuation you lived on Adanac Street in Vancouver?

A. Yes. And I moved to Triumph Street temporarily before evacuation.

Q. Now, I understand that you had a considerable number of household goods and chattels which were stored at 992 Powell Street?

A. Yes.

Q. Those premises were known as the M. Furuya Company warehouse and a good many of the Japanese people stored their property there at the time of evacuation?

A. I did at the time I left. I don't know about anybody else's goods.

Q. Were your goods marked with your name or any distinguishing mark? A. Yes. With a number



1 and they had my name on them.

2 Q. I understand there were also some goods left
3 at 1937 Adanac Street, too?

4 A. There were some things there until I went to
5 camp, and when I went to camp they were all taken to
6 992 Powell Street.

7 Q. There was one bed that was left at 2307
8 Oxford Street and was that taken over to Powell Street,
9 too?

10 A. No, that wasn't taken over. My wife took
11 that with her when she was evacuated.

12 Q. I understand that on evacuation you went to
13 Tashme.

14 A. Yes.

15 Q. And you wrote to the Custodian and asked that
16 certain goods be sent to you and they were sent to you?

17 A. Yes. I received some.

18 Q. Now, are there any goods that you are claiming
19 for today that you did receive?

20 A. No.

21 Q. That is, with the exception, I take it, of
22 the items which are on sheet two of your claim, being
23 cartons 6, 7 and 8 which you say you did receive but
24 the contents were damaged beyond use?

25 A. Yes. That is true.

26 Q. So far as the other matters are concerned,
27 I think there is a very detailed list of these articles
28 with the date of purchase and the condition and price
29 and so on.



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CROSS-EXAMINATION BY MR. CHRISTIE:

Q. I am showing you a J.P. Form dated July 23, 1942. Is that your signature (Indicating)?

A. Yes.

Q. And you did not claim for any personal property on your form?

A. No.

Q. I am showing you another J.P. Form dated July 15, 1942. Whose signature is that?

A. That is my wife's.

Q. And the claim for these various goods were made on her form?

A. Yes. That is when I went to camp.

Q. Who made up these lists to know what was in these different cartons, you or your wife?

A. I made those before I went to the road camp.

Q. When did you go to the camp?

A. The 25th of March, 1942.

Q. Where were you when you signed this J.P. Form?

A. Gosnell. I left the road camp on the 21st July, 1942, and came back to Vancouver and went to Tashme a week later.

Q. Were you present when your wife made this list that is signed by her and filed with her J.P. Form on the 15th July, 1942?

A. No, I was not.

Q. And this list was made by your wife of all the goods in these cartons?

THE SUB-COMMISSIONER: He said before it was made by himself.



1 MR. CHRISTIE: Q. Where did your wife get the
2 list that is in the J.P. Form?

3 A. The Custodian made that list from a copy
4 supplied by me.

5 Q. Did you pack **all** these goods in these different
6 cartons, yourself, or was that done by your wife?

7 A. I packed them all before I left for the
8 camp.

9 Q. When did you put the values on these various
10 goods in these cartons?

11 A. At the time I packed them.

12 Q. Why didn't you put the values on the lists
13 which were contained in the J.P. Form?

14 A. I didn't think there was any necessity for it
15 at the time.

16 Q. When did you estimate these values on your
17 claim form?

18 A. I filled these prices in from the original
19 list I made at the time I left.

20 Q. Was that done last, these values put on?

21 A. Yes.

22 Q. Now, I am advised that 19 cartons were
23 shipped to you or your wife on October 28, 1943?

24 A. Yes, those were received.

25 Q. The 19? A. Yes. I think that was
26 about the number.

27 Q. I am advised that cartons No. 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,
28 9,12,13,14,15,16,17,18,21,22,23,24,25 and 26 were the
29 cartons which were received by you. Do you remember
30 whether those were the cartons or not?



1 A. I received about 19 boxes but I don't think
2 those are the ones.

3 Q. Will you tell us briefly what type of goods
4 were in these boxes you received? Did you receive
5 any dishes?

6 A. No, we did not.

7 Q. Did you receive any glassware?

8 A. No.

9 Q. Did you receive any flower vases?

10 A. No.

11 Q. Did you receive any games or a wash boiler?

12 A. No. There was no wash boiler, but we received
13 a couple of games.

14 Q. They were all in carton number 9. Did you
15 receive an enamelled pot, a kettle or a bamboo screen?

16 A. No.

17 Q. Did you receive the silverware set?

18 A. No.

19 Q. Did you receive any iron pot or aluminium lunch
20 box? A. No.

21 Q. Did you get an electric egg beater?

22 A. No.

23 Q. Did you receive any tableclothes?

24 A. No.

25 Q. Any Japanese books?

26 A. No.

27 Q. Any records or record-player?

28 A. No.

29 Q. Any picture frames?

30 A. No.



1 Q. Did you receive any buckets?

2 A. No.

3 Q. Roller skates?

4 A. No.

5 Q. A Hoover cleaner? A. Yes.

6 Q. Three rugs? A. Yes, we received
7 three rugs but they were all torn and were not in
8 useable condition.

9 Q. What about garden tools?

10 A. Yes, those came.

11 Q. Shaving sets?

12 A. No.

13 Q. Electric stove?

14 A. Yes. That came but it was all broken and
15 not useable, so I am claiming for that.

16 Q. Curtains? A. No.

17 Q. In the notation there are 19 boxes. What
18 other goods did you receive besides the ones you have
19 told me you did get?

20 A. Some Christmas tree decorations which I did
21 not ask for came and a few plants.

22 Q. Anything else?

23 A. Twelve or fourteen Japanese Tea Cups came but
24 they were all smashed and broken, too.

25 Q. How many boxes out of the 19 would be broken?

26 A. Some of the boxes were completely empty and
27 some of them just had paper packing in them. About half
28 of them were damaged or empty.

29 Q. Are you telling us that the trucking people
30 delivered empty boxes to you?



1 A. The truck arrived late at night at Tashme
2 and just unloaded the cases, and it was afterwards that
3 I checked them up.

4 Q. Was anyone present when you opened the boxes?

5 A. Just my wife and members of my family.

6 Q. Did you make any complaint to the Custodian
7 right away that some of these articles were missing?

8 A. Yes. I reported the things which were
9 missing.

10 Q. You reported that by letter?

11 A. Yes.

12 Q. Where were you when you got these boxes?

13 A. At Tashme.

14 Q. Were you living in a house there?

15 A. Yes.

16 Q. When the goods were taken off the truck where
17 were they put?

18 A. In front of the house.

19 Q. And how long were they left in front of the
20 house?

21 A. About three or four hours.

22 Q. Then you took them into the house?

23 A. Yes.

24 Q. Could somebody have got at these boxes while
25 they were in front of the house and stolen this stuff?

26 A. I don't think so. I couldn't be sure.

27 Q. When you took the boxes into the house were
28 they still fastened up or had they been opened?

29 A. Some of them were still neatly fastened up
30 and others were broken open.



1 Q. How long have you been married?

2 A. Since 1925.

3 Q. When were most of these household goods you
4 are claiming for purchased?

5 A. About 1937 or 1938.

6 Q. This dining room suite you are claiming \$75.
7 for, where was it bought?

8 A. I didn't buy it direct, I bought it through
9 a store.

10 Q. What kind of a dining room set was it?

11 A. Hardwood.

12 Q. Was this baby bed wooden or metal?

13 A. It was metal.

14 Q. And what about this table, was it new when
15 you bought it?

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. Where did you buy it? A. I bought it
18 through the store where I was working.

19 Q. And this cleaning machine, is that a Hoover?

20 A. It is not the Hoover, I have forgotten the name
21 of it.

22 Q. What was its purpose?

23 A. It was for housecleaning.

24 Q. Was it an electric machine?

25 A. Yes.

26 Q. And the sofa, was it new when you bought it?

27 A. Yes.

28 Q. Where did you buy it?

29 A. I got the company I was working for to buy it
30 for me.



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Q. What did he pay for it?

A. About \$100, I think.

Q. What about the two bureau cases, were they new when you bought them, and what material were they made of?

A. Hardwood, they would be new.

Q. I tender as Exhibit 4 the bill of lading of the Rural Truck Lines Association, dated October 28th, 1943. There is a description of the articles shipped in this bill of lading.

It is submitted, your honour, that the articles of personal property which were sold were sold at their fair market value.

It is submitted that the valuation of the other articles of personal property claimed by the claimant is excessive and it is submitted that the 19 cartons of other goods were shipped by the Custodian to the claimant. Whether any of these articles were received by the claimant or not seems to be indoubt. If they were received it would appear he is making a claim for goods that he has received.
