MR. OUIMET: The next case, my lord, is No. 23,
Masao Miyamoto.

This, my lord, is a claim for personal property,
the original claim is a thousand dollars less
\$336.70, leaving a net balance of \$663.30. The
original claim was for \$663.30, so it need not be
amended.

10

MASAO MIYAMOTO, the claimant herein, being
first duly sworn, testified through
the Interpreter as follows:

DIRECT EXAMINATION BY MR. OUIMET:

Q Mr. Miyamoto, you are the claimant in this case?

A Yes.

Q Would you take communication of the personal
chattels form bearing your signature and identify
same and file it with its contents as Exhibit 1?

A Yes.

(STATEMENT MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 1).

20

MR. OUIMET: Would my learned friend tender the
personal property analysis which is referred to in
the form and which I will file as Exhibit 2.

MR. HUNTER: I file the analysis of personal property
claim as Exhibit 2.

(ANALYSIS MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 2).

30

MR. OUIMET: Q: Now, Mr. Miyamoto, you are claiming a
watch. Apparently you had two watches and you
are claiming for one Montcalm watch. My lord,
instead of making an analysis of each small amount,
there have been amounts added to make a total of
so much for so many articles.

M. Miyamoto,
In Chief.

THE COMMISSIONER: I see.

MR. OUIMET: Now, what is the answer?

A Yes, I had two watches, one ordinary work day watch and one Sunday watch. I received the ordinary watch, but not the more expensive one.

MR. OUIMET: That is all, my lord. The gold watch is No. 29 on ~~ybar~~ analysis of personal property claim, valued at \$20.00.

MR. HUNTER: It is submitted, my lord, that the personal
10 property was sold for its fair market value. It is submitted that the claims made for personal property not sold are excessive.

I see some notations here but they don't appear to be particularly relevant. It is noticed that the electro-lux was purchased in September of 1941 for \$98.45, including carrying charges.

THE COMMISSIONER: Which are you reading from now?

Oh, I see. You say \$98.00? The electro-lux is shown on Exhibit 1 as having cost \$85.00.

20 MR. HUNTER: It was purchased for \$98.45, including carrying charges. If your Lordship knows finance companies charge a fair rate of interest.

THE COMMISSIONER: Yes, that will clear that up.

MR. HUNTER: And the sewing machine cost \$114.00, of which \$53.50 had been paid. There are letters here from the various companies, the electro-lux and the Singer Sewing Machine Company, but there is no use burdening the record unless my friend disputes the purchase price.

30 MR. OUIMET: No, I certainly don't.

I would only ask if it is possible that the Interpreter tell the prices that are being set so that the witness may verify them.

THE COMMISSIONER: Yes, I think that should be done.

If you will pass that on to the claimant, the information Mr. Hunter has given us. First of all, the Electro-Lux cost \$98.45, including carrying charges, and the Singer Sewing Machine cost \$114.00 on account of which \$53.00 had been paid
10 by the claimant.

A There was \$53.00 owing at the time that I left, but the machine was sold without my knowledge and I continued to make regular payments until the full amount had been paid up.

THE COMMISSIONER: Yes, all right, Mr. Hunter.

MR. HUNTER: The rest appears, my lord, to be largely a question of value. There are largely inclusive values placed on a large number of items, so it is rather difficult to make a comparison with every
20 sale.

THE COMMISSIONER: It is gratifying to observe there was no pilfering.

MR. HUNTER: That was, I must say in fairness to the claimant, due to his actions in having properly stored them, my lord. Your Lordship will notice there are a few items here which were supposed to have been shipped. I don't know whether my
learned friend knows whether these were received or not.

30 MR. QUIMET: I don't think they were, but the witness

could be asked the question whether he received them.

CROSS-EXAMINATION BY MR. HUNTER:

Q Mr. Miyamoto, I notice under items "unsold" there were turned over to Mrs. Yone Miyamoto for shipment to you at your request these items, (indicating). Would you point out Mr. Handford, whether he ever received these things?

A The things I received should appear separately on another list that you have there.

THE COMMISSIONER: Mr. Hunter, is the point not whether he received them or whether they were delivered to his wife for shipment to him, because I presume the Custodian would not accept responsibility if the delivery was made by the wife.

MR. HUNTER: But if he has received them, that proves it conclusively.

MR. OUIMET: At the time, my lord, I understand the claimant was single so they couldn't have been shipped to his wife, but I see from the record they were left with a close friend, a Mrs. S. Miyamoto, but it wasn't his wife. They were sent to Mrs. S. Miyamoto at his request.

THE COMMISSIONER: Have you a list of the articles that were received by him?

MR. OUIMET: He says the list I have in my possession now contains the names of the articles that were received by him, so we might file this.

THE COMMISSIONER: Yes, but have him identify it first.

MR. OUIMET: Q: Will you identify the list of articles which were handed to Mrs. S. Miyamoto to be sent to you?

A: The articles I received are listed separately.

Q When you say that the articles are listed separately, do you mean to say they are not mentioned in the personal analysis form which the Interpreter is holding?

10 A The goods I received are in this list, but separate from the rest of the goods.

THE COMMISSIONER: Now, Mr. Interpreter, would you hand him the document and let him point out where the things are listed?

A The goods I received are not being claimed for.

THE COMMISSIONER: There is his claim.

A The witness can't identify them because he can't read English. Possibly Mr. Okuda could give the information.

MR. OKUDA: Yes.

20 MR. HUNTER: There are only about four items. Let us ask him, because it will save a lot of trouble. There are only about four items supposed to have been given to this woman. It would be quicker to ask him about them.

THE COMMISSIONER: Why not refer directly to the four items that the Custodian indicates have been sent to him and find out whether he received them?

THE INTERPRETER: That is the question I put in the first place.

30 THE COMMISSIONER: Let Mr. Okuda have it and see if he

can make him understand.

MR. OUIMET: My lord, I am told I am wanted on the
'phone. Could I be excused for a moment?

THE COMMISSIONER: Yes.

MR. HUNTER: Q: What does he say about it?

MR. OKUDA: (Interpreting the answer). What I reported
on the personal property claim form are all those
that had been notified by myself ---

Q There are only five items here. Surely he knows
whether he received them or not.

10

A $\frac{1}{2}$ Of those articles I received three duplicates.
In the case of a pair of gloves, I had two, of
which I only received one.

Q It says one here. He is only claiming for one.

A The following was handed to Mrs. Y. Miyamoto to be
sent to Mr. Miyamoto at his request. I had two
gold watches. One was a Montcalm and a Waltham
and the one I received was a Waltham watch, but not
the Montcalm, and in the case of underwear as
well as sweat shirts, there were two or three of
them at the time, of which I received one each
and whatever I received I haven't claimed for on
the personal property claim form.

20

Q I see. Who is this Mrs. Yone Miyamoto?

A Mrs. Yone Miyamoto is the wife of Mr. D. Miyamoto.

Q Who is he? A: A personal friend.

Q Is he a relative? A: Just a family
friend. No relation whatsoever.

THE COMMISSIONER: Does that conclude this claim?

30 MR. OUIMET: It does, my lord.

said?

A: No.

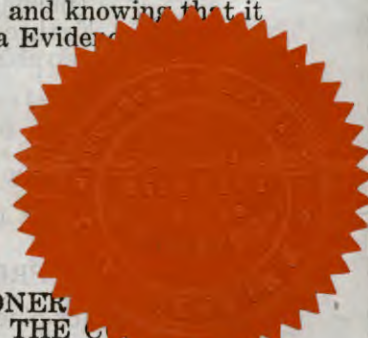
