MR. BRAIDWOOD: My lord, we thought we might just have a few informal words this morning on the matter of the case of the Haney Fruit Ranchers' Association.

As your Lordship is probably aware, my friend, Mr. McMaster, has been viewing the property in question with Mr. Shears, and an attempt has been made to try to come to some agreement on the details of the case.

10

This is rather an involved matter, and the claim is somewhat complicated. Consequently I have brought Mr. Shears here this morning, and Mr. McMaster has, to a certain extent, been prepared for Mr. Shears coming, but I would say ~~it is~~ ^{not} is/my intention this morning to try and make a final disposition of this case, but merely to have Mr. Shears and Mr. McMaster give some indication as to the manner in which both sides propose to conduct the case and that it be stood down at your Lordship's pleasure, I suggest, for more consultation between Mr. Shears and Mr. McMaster, and then perhaps some final disposition can be worked out subject to your Lordship's approval.

20

THE COMMISSIONER: I do not recall the nature of the claim.

MR. McMASTER: The claim has not been given a number yet, and I think that should be done, first of all.

30

THE COMMISSIONER: That should be done now. This is not a corporate claim, is it?

MR. McMASTER: Well, it is a registered society, my lord. I suppose it is a corporation, in a sense.

THE COMMISSIONER: Are we treating the corporate claims numerically along with the individual claims?

THE SECRETARY: Yes, my lord.

THE COMMISSIONER: I think we better treat this as a formal proceeding, Mr. McMaster, if you don't mind.

10 MR. McMASTER: Yes, my lord. With respect to this case, my lord, it came on first at Kamloops, I believe at the time of the sub-Commission hearings, and at that time the situation appeared that the real property was still in the name of the Custodian and had never been sold.

20 I believe that for awhile the Custodian had rented a portion of the property, one of the large buildings for storage purposes, and there is some indication that the premises had been broken into on a number of occasions.

30 The Haney Fruit Ranchers' Association is a society, incorporated under the laws of the Province, and on their property situated at Haney there is a large building which had been used as a community hall, and another house -- another building which was used as a Judo hall, and two small houses, and a kindergarten building, and certain of these buildings have been rented to tenants by the Custodian from time to time, I think.

Likewise, the society had a large quantity of goods and chattels stored in the premises, and at the time the matter was dealt with counsel for the Crown and ourselves dealt with it on the claim, and there was some question as to (a) damage to the buildings on the premises and (b) as to what goods were left there still; and it was decided it would be advisable to try and work out some kind of an arrangement with the Custodian concerning the matter before presenting any claim either with a view to coming to some agreement with him and not presenting a claim, or, alternatively, presenting a claim and arriving at some settlement in the matter.

10

I think my learned friend is agreeing we should file in evidence a copy of the original analysis of personal property claim which the Custodian provided us with, and it sets forth under the analysis of claim in typewriting the values the society has placed on the various articles there claimed for. That is in the right hand column.

20

Those values, I might say, were provided by the former president of the society and have been provided to the Custodian. I will have to amend the claim with regard to chattels. I think the actual claim form is for \$1500.00 odd.

THE COMMISSIONER: \$1507.00.

30 MR. McMASTER: And apparently these items total

\$1492.08. So I would amend in that respect, and I would ask to file this analysis of personal property claim, with the claim values on it, for the purpose of the claim values only as Exhibit No. 1.

THE COMMISSIONER: Are you amending the claim form, to reduce the claim?

MR. McMASTER: With respect to chattels, to \$1492.08. So I would amend in that respect.

10 THE COMMISSIONER: \$1492.08, for chattels only.

MR. McMASTER: I think we agreed, my lord, the credits to the Custodian on the sale of property amount to \$156.00 on tender and \$74.35 at auction sales; that makes a total of \$230.35, my lord.

THE COMMISSIONER: Yes. We had better have this marked before we forget it. Do you wish to put in the original? The Custodian's analysis of claim will be Exhibit 1.

(CLAIMS ANALYSIS MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 1397-1)

20 MR. McMASTER: My lord, I might mention the second branch of the claim, which relates to the damage to the property in the sum claimed for a value of \$200.00, and that refers primarily to broken windows on the premises. I will say quite frankly, my lord, I am not quite certain this is a matter within the terms of reference, but it is a matter that I would like to have an opportunity of discussing with Crown counsel and make representations to the Commissioner.

30

THE COMMISSIONER: I see. It is a claim for damage to the building?

MR. McMASTER: I think Mr. Shears and I are agreed, my lord, there are approximately 80 to 100 panes of glass broken, the panes of glass being about ten by sixteen in size.

MR. SHEARS: 10 x 16 in size, the standard size.

MR. McMASTER: Now, the Custodian's office has prepared, my lord, a statement of what they allege was still on the premises, and I would ask my friend to be good enough to produce that, and have it marked as Exhibit 2.

MR. BRAIDWOOD: I am producing an inventory of items still on hand, insofar as the Custodian's office is able to obtain the information. That is a total of a sum of \$415.75 of the claim value.

THE COMMISSIONER: \$415.75.

MR. BRAIDWOOD: Of claim value, my lord.

THE COMMISSIONER: These are chattels, I take it?

MR. BRAIDWOOD: Yes, my lord.

(INVENTORY MARKED EXHIBIT NO. 1397-2).

THE COMMISSIONER: Are they still in the building?

MR. BRAIDWOOD: Yes, my lord.

MR. McMASTER: Well, my suggestion, my lord, is that this matter should be dealt with in the ordinary course in discussions as to settlement of these matters, subject to speaking to the question of damage.

THE COMMISSIONER: Have you any objection to that, Mr. Braidwood?

MR. BRAIDWOOD: No, I have no objection, my lord. I was wondering, since I have Mr. Shears here this morning, if your Lordship has any questions or desires any information that you might obtain from Mr. Shears. Mr. Shears has been on the property at least twice recently, and is well acquainted with the property concerned.

10 THE COMMISSIONER: I think it might be as well if we had a statement from Mr. Shears on the record as to what has transpired in respect of this property.

MR. SHEARS: I am in agreement with all that has been said, which is in accord with the facts. The building was rented by the Custodian, that is a portion of it for the purpose of auctions, and we have credited to the society 33 months' rent for the use of the property. There are other rentals that have also been credited to the Association, coming from tenants of other buildings.

20 The property has been badly damaged through vandalism, from the point of view of the windows being broken. I did have to point out to Mr. McMaster that the damage was from the outside, and not from the inside, because they are all screened up from the inside, so it was just not damaged caused by the use of the Custodian.

30 There are some eighty to one hundred of these panes of glass broken. I did find out only this morning, sir, that the actual cost of glass seems to be at a minimum, though a single pane of glass

costs sixty cents, in cases of 90 sheets it costs \$8.95. So \$8.95 would cover the cost of the glass. That is for whatever consideration should be given to it.

THE COMMISSIONER: The labour cost would probably be quite considerable.

10 MR. SHEARS: Then, as regards the remaining chattels, this place has been broken into on more than one occasion, and I would say more than a question of things being stolen it has been a question of vandalism and spoiling of goods.

The list that has been put in with you as Exhibit 2 is quite accurate. I only saw these goods yesterday, as a matter of fact, and those particular goods are in the condition in which they were left, I would say.

20 I would also say I believe there are other goods for which additional claim was made which seemed to be on the premises strewn around and in such bad shape it may be fair to consider them as entirely lost.

THE COMMISSIONER: The building never was sold by the Custodian?

MR. SHEARS: No, the building never was sold by the Custodian.

THE COMMISSIONER: So, presumably it has now reverted in the owner, subject to any damage that has been done in the interval.

30 MR. McMASTER: The Custodian has given the society notice that he intends to re-vest, and the society

is trying to get itself in a position to deal with the property.

THE COMMISSIONER: Does that substantially cover the situation, Mr. Shears?

MR. SHEARS: Yes, I think so, my lord.

MR. BRAIDWOOD: May I take it then, that this matter will be adjourned sine die for further discussion between Crown counsel and counsel for the claimant??

10 THE COMMISSIONER: Your purpose being to endeavour to agree on compensation for the damage or stolen goods and come to me with a report as to your joint views on it, is that it?

MR. BRAIDWOOD: Yes, and a further purpose, that my friend is to make representations to me as to the damage to the property, and I am to consider the Crown's position on that.

THE COMMISSIONER: Well, that seems to be the most practical solution for it, at the moment.

20 MR. BRAIDWOOD: Will my friend agree it will not be necessary to call further evidence in this case?

MR. McMASTER: As far as I am aware.

THE COMMISSIONER: Can we give it a fixed date now?

MR. BRAIDWOOD: There is no reason why not, my lord.

THE COMMISSIONER: I think it is desirable. If counsel think they can get together on it between now and the end of the month -- the last date I have here is June 23rd.

MR. McMASTER: The 13th would be satisfactory.

30 THE COMMISSIONER: That is a Monday. The Haney Fruit

Ranchers' Association claim will go until the 13th, then. Now, that disposes of this case, as far as we can go at the moment.

MR. BRAIDWOOD: Yes, my lord.

(PROCEEDINGS ADJOURNED UNTIL JUNE 13th, 1949)
