

Notice to Persons of the Japanese race who are leaving for Japan.REGISTRATION OF REAL AND PERSONAL PROPERTY  
LEFT IN CANADA

A form will be provided for this purpose which must be prepared in triplicate and should be in readiness for delivery to the Custodian's Agent.

This registration will provide a final opportunity for you to inform the Custodian of all your remaining property of every kind whatsoever and it is desirable therefore that THE INFORMATION YOU SUPPLY BE ACCURATE AND COMPLETE.

Real Property

If you are the owner of real property or have any interest in real property situated anywhere in Canada, this must now be declared and full particulars given in regard to same.

Personal Property

Apart from the goods which you will be permitted to take with you and the amount which may subsequently be shipped, all other personal property left with the Custodian must be dealt with as follows:

It will be the responsibility of each person to properly pack and deliver to a designated storage all such effects which are to be left with the Custodian. Goods owned by different persons must not be packed in the same box.

YOUR FULL NAME AND REGISTRATION NUMBER MUST APPEAR ON EACH BOX and each box must be marked or tagged with a list of the contents. This information must then be listed on the form provided.

All real and personal property becomes vested in the Custodian at the time of your departure for Japan. This property will be sold and the net proceeds placed to your credit for transfer to Japan when reasonably possible following your departure.

In every household there is always a considerable quantity of goods which are of so little intrinsic value that the

cost of packing and selling charges is often more than the article would realize by sale. This is particularly true of secondhand clothing and anything in addition to what you can take with you, or which can be shipped later, should be disposed of by yourself if at all possible. The cost of removal to Vancouver or other points at which your goods may be sold will be a charge upon the owner and very careful consideration should therefore be given to what is left with the Custodian. Before going to the expense of packing, it would be desirable to discard and destroy anything which may add to the expense of handling and cost of selling. The Custodian will take all reasonable care of your property and endeavour to dispose of same to the best advantage, but accepts no responsibility in regard to same.
