The ship's position at noon on the 21st July was
Latitude 30° 27' North : Longitude 130° 23' East
Day's Run 565 miles. Average Speed 23.54 knots
Distance from Hong Kong 1011 miles.
Distance to Kobe 357 miles.

The temperature at noon yesterday was 86°F.

Sunset today 7.11 p.m. Sunrise tomorrow 4.50 a.m.

AIR CONDITIONING:

In connection with the Air Conditioning of the ship you may be interested to know the following statistics which were recorded between Hong Kong and Kobe on the 21st July, when humidity and temperature were at their highest:-

Humidity	90%
Shade temperature	89 degrees F.
Sun temperature	108 degrees F.
Sea Water Temperature	83 degrees F.

Approximately 150 tons of water were extracted from the air.
Average temperature throughout the ship at 2 p.m. was 74°F.

It is interesting to note that a passenger sitting in the Cinema in the Gallery, gives off enough heat to bring 24 czs. of water to the boil per hour, or when dancing 64 czs. per hour.

The weight of air circulating throughout the ship per hour is 680 tons and the machinery used to cool the air extracts enough heat to melt 1350 tons of ice per day.
