Dear Schooox Madam,

Provisional approval has now been received for your entry into Canada. with your children, Rieko, Takashi and Mitsuko.

Your first step is to obtain a Japanese passport which is required in connection with the preparation of medical documents. After you have obtained your passport the following medical papers are required from a hospital of well-known repute:

- An x-ray film of the chest, not smaller than 14" x 17". The film must show the applicant's name and passport number over the signature of the radiologist, together with the date the x-ray was taken.
- A radiologist's report on the x-ray film: the applicant's name and passport number must be stated and the report must be signed.
- Medical examination by a doctor of high repuse on the enclosed form IMS 17.
- 4. The above documents are to be completed in English and returned to the Embassy as som as possible, together with the required fee of ¥ 605 to cover airmail charges to Ottawa.
- Children under 11 years of age do NOT require x-ray films of the chest.

As soon as a report on your case is received I shall inform you of the results.
