Approval has now been received for your entry into Canada and the Embassy has been authorized to grant you/an immigrant visa, provided you are in possession of: **And Your wife Tsuma**

1. A valid passport
2. Satisfactory evidence that you have sufficient funds to cover expenses from Japan to your point of destination in Canada.

The issuance of an immigrant visa will not guarantee your admission to Canada; as a further x-ray and medical examination may be required, without cost to you, upon your arrival. Your definite entry into Canada will depend on the outcome of this test.

I am obliged to inform you that the validity of the present approval extends only to **November 22, 1962**. That is to say, under the present approval your entry into Canada must take place prior to **November 22, 1962**. Should you fail to arrive in Canada before this date a further set of medical documents must be submitted and a new approval authorized for your entry into Canada.


Please note that you must land at one of the following ports of entry:

Dorval	St. John's, Newfoundland
Gander	Saint John, New Brunswick
Halifax	Sydney, Nova Scotia
Malton	Toronto
Montreal	Vancouver
Quebec City	Victoria

You are advised to obtain a Certificate showing that you have been vaccinated against smallpox within the last three years unless you can furnish satisfactory evidence that you are immune from this disease by reason of having had it during that period. This will prevent your being detained in a quarantine section, or your being requested to submit to vaccination on your arrival in Canada.

When you call at the Embassy, **IN PERSON**, for your visa, I will be glad to give you any further information you may require.
