Please find enclosed my receipt in the amount of one thousand eight hundred two dollars and sixty cents (\$1802.60). I wish to thank you for paying this account promptly.

I have been in contact with Mr. Takenaka who has advised me of the content of your letter. The cheque from the Custodian is now deposited in The Royal Bank of Canada, 214 Bay Street, Toronto, Ontario. The Account Number is 1456 and on August 13th the entry showed a balance of \$28,373.16. On August 13th the pass book and cheque book were handed to Mr. Takenaka who is accepting responsibility to have it delivered to you.

I note that you mention in your letter that you hold shares in The Canadian Miyo Society and that you would like me to recover value for them. I have not yet received the share certificate from Mr. Takenaka, but when I have looked into the matter further and have been able to determine the amount due in your favour, if any, I shall be able to state an arrangement concerning fees.
