Dear Mr. Kasho:

Since my last letter to you of October 1st, 1952, I have been in close contact with Mr. T. Takenaka who has very kindly kept me informed of all correspondence. On November 1st, 1952, I received a letter from the Office of the Custodian, Ottawa, asking that I secure from you a formal application for release of assets. It was after receipt of this letter that I was in touch with Mr. Takenaka again and arranged to send you a second application.

In letter of January 14th, 1953, I am advised by the Office of the Custodian that they have received a declaration completed by you. I am enclosing a photostat copy of this letter which raises a question concerning the name on your original naturalization certificate. As stated earlier in a letter received from the Citizenship Registration Branch, of which a photostat is also enclosed, it appears that their early records have you listed as Jisabura Rashio.

I have written to the Office of the Custodian to correct the error of name in the records and any misapprehension they may have by enclosing the statement from the Registrar of Canadian Citizenship which advises that your citizenship is not revoked. I have also offered to present additional supporting evidence in person, if necessary. With the documents you sent me, I believe that we should have no difficulty in clearing up any misunderstanding there may be.
