Jisaburo Kasho.

I have received your letter of January 12th which advises that an application for release of assets was received from Jisaburo Kasho.

Your letter refers to a letter dated September 12, 1952, from the Department of Citizenship and Immigration, reference number 20586-49, which indicates that according to their records Jisabura Rashio was issued a certificate of naturalization at Nanaimo, British Columbia, on June 25, 1909. You ask for evidence to establish that Jisaburo Kasho who signed the declaration is one and the same person as Jisabura Rashio referred to in the letter from the Department of Citizenship and Immigration.

In order to solve this problem of identity, I enclose herewith letter dated May 22, 1951, from J. E. Duggan, Registrar of Canadian Citizenship, addressed to Jisaburo Kasho, with covering letter from C. E. McGeaghey, Vice Consul of Canada in Japan, advising that his Canadian citizenship is not revoked.

In addition, I have other documents, including a copy of the certificate of naturalization, supplied by the Canadian Liaison Mission, Tokyo, dated March 10, 1950. If necessary, I shall be pleased to present these documents for examination, personally, at your request.
