I have received your letter of November 1st, asking that the formal application of Mr. Jisaburo Kasho for the release of his assets presently under the control of the Custodian, be filed.

An Application for Release was drafted and with a copy of the Instructions for Release ~~was~~ sent to Mr. Kasho by registered air-mail post on October 1st, addressed to 659-2, Nishi-Kaizuka-shi, Osaka-fu, Japan, the address heretofore used in correspondence but in fact the residence of Mr. Kasho's son.
