
Dear Sir:

This is with reference to your letter of September 26 addressed to Mr. Baldwin concerning Miss Ayako Kubodera.

We have ascertained from our records that one, Ayako Kubodera, age 17, unmarried, arrived in Canada on April 5, 1926, at the port of Vancouver, British Columbia, on the S.S. "Empress of Canada". She was allowed entry under temporary status effective May 7 destined to her father, Mr. Y. Kubodera of Lotimer Rd., Cloverdale, British Columbia. Miss Kubodera was accompanied by her mother, Chikaye, age 37, who was allowed entry on May 7 as a returning Canadian.

We have no information on file to establish that Miss Kubodera's parents ever sought her permanent admission to Canada. Evidently, when she arrived here in 1926, she only intended to visit since she was allowed entry for this purpose.
