Further to our letter of the 9th of March, 1949, I wish to inform you that we have received a despatch from our mission in Tokyo, concerning the entry to Japan of Mr. Tokio Maikawa and his family.

The present policy of entry to Japan being administered by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander, Allied Powers precludes entry into Japan for individuals who will be employed by a firm which has been organized in Japan. General Headquarters have ruled that the entry into Japan of Mr. Maikawa and his family cannot be favourably considered.
