Re: Tokio and Misao Maikawa

I am enclosing herewith two completed forms S, Declaration of Renunciation of Canadian Citizenship under Section 17 (1) of the Canadian Citizenship Act, together with fee of ten dollars (\$10.00). These declarations were made by Tokio Maikawa and his wife, Misao, of 173 Donlands Avenue, Toronto, and were properly sworn before Carl J. Herman, a Commissioner of Oaths.

Mr. and Mrs. Maikawa have two daughters of minor age, Minako, born in Vancouver; B.C., on October 20, 1937, and Yoko, born in Bridge River, B.C., on January 2, 1943, who under Section 18 (1) of the Canadian Citizenship Act also cease to be Canadian citizens.

This family intends to enter Japan for permanent residence and for this purpose they must furnish proof that they are Japanese nationals. May I, therefore, request that these declarations be acknowledged by your Branch.
