Re: Tokio and Misao Maikawa

This is further to my letter of April 12, 1949, which accompanied two completed Forms 3, Declaration of Renunciation of Canadian Citizenship under Section 17 (1) of the Canadian Citizenship Act, in the names of Tokio Maikawa and his wife Misao Maikawa.

The receipt from your Department, No. X 2850, in the amount of \$10.00, is marked "Certificate of Declaration of Renunciation of Canadian Citizenship re. Tokio Maikawa & Mrs. Misao Maikawa".

Although I can find no reference to a certificate of this nature in the body of the Act nor in the Regulations, I find in Regulation 22 that "Declarations of Alienage, .... shall be filed as of record", and should this mean that a certificate can be properly issued, as intimated on the receipt mentioned above, may I request that such certificate be issued in due course and forwarded to my address.

As previously mentioned in my letter of April 12th, this family desires to enter Japan for permanent residence and must furnish proof that they are Japanese nationals. For this reason, should there be no certificate to cover this renunciation, I would request further that they be issued some statement from your record to certify that declarations of renunciation have been completed.
