Re: Kyuyemon Yonemitsu

Your joint letter of March 29th 1952 addressed to the Department of the Secretary of State, Office of the Custodian, 506 Royal Bank Building, Hastings & Granville, Vancouver, B.C. has been forwarded to this office for attention. Please be advised that the Vancouver office of the Custodian was closed on March 31st 1952 and all files and records of that office were shipped to the Custodian in Ottawa. The delay in replying to your letter was caused by these circumstances.

This case has been reviewed and your application for release of the assets must be made in the usual manner, that is it must be in the form of a declaration or affidavit which meets the requirements of the Custodian's "Instructions to applicants for Release", a copy of which is enclosed herein for your guidance.

In support of the application you must supply the Custodian with a release or waiver of claim duly executed by Toranosuke Emoto and by Isuke Yonemitsu respectively, that is, there must be separate waiver of claim from each of the aforementioned before consideration can be given to your application for release.

Documentary evidence must be supplied in support of the said application for release, which will establish that Kyuyemon Yonemitsu, who was formerly the registered owner of the premises known as 3683 Peardonville Road, Abbotsford, B.C. is the same man as Kyuemon Yonemitsu who asserted the Power of Attorney dated March 13th 1952 in your favour.

On receipt of this material, I shall be pleased topresent the case again for the Custodian's consideration.
