

A F F I D A V I T

IN THE MATTER OF TORANOSUKE EMOTO AND A CERTAIN
DWELLING LOCATED AT 3683 PEARDONVILLE ROAD, ABBOTSFORD,
BRITISH COLUMBIA.

I, Isuke Yonemitsu, of the City of Toronto, County of York,
Province of Ontario, Watchmaker, make oath and say:

1. That I was owner of the north-west portion of property located at 3683 Peardonville Road, Abbotsford, British Columbia, being a part of the seventy (70) acres, more or less, registered in the name of my brother, Kyuyemon Yonemitsu.
2. That subsequent to purchase of this property from my brother, Kyuyemon Yonemitsu, in 1927, and until I was evacuated in 1942, I had possession of this property.
3. That in 1937, I was asked by Toranosuke Emoto, a sawmill worker, for permission to move and locate on my property a house which he had received from the sawmill and which he would inhabit on a temporary basis.
4. That I agreed to permit Toranosuke Emoto to move and locate his house on my property without charge of rent, but in return, it was agreed that when he moved from the property for any reason whatsoever, ownership of the house was to become automatically transferred to me and that he would thereby forego all rights of ownership.
5. That Toranosuke Emoto left the house and moved from the property in 1942.
6. That Toranosuke Emoto went to Japan in 1946.
7. That despite my efforts to locate him, I have been unable to learn the whereabouts of Toranosuke Emoto.
