Dear Sir:

On September 21, 1943, Mrs. Z. Kinoshita of Rosebery acting in the capacity as interpreter for the Japanese Women's Association of Rosebery, met Mr. Boultbee to further negotiations to improve system of water supply for the part of Rosebery where Japanese are carrying water from the creek.

In the midst of above conversation Mrs. Kinoshta received a severe "slap in the face" from Mr. Boultbee. Such action by Mr. Boultbee is inexcusable as there was nothing said by Mrs. Kinoshita which warranted such action from Mr. Boultbee.

Wherefore, to prevent Mr. Boultbee or any other Officers of B.C. Security Commission from resorting to force against any Japanese women in any future time, we ask for your assurance.
