Regarding your letter of June 8th stating that 12 men wish to transfer to some point where construction is going on.

It is regretted that all building construction has been completed at these camps for the present. I have been informed that building construction at other points and projects has also been completed and doubtless a number of good carpenters, etc., are in the same position.

In view of this, it is evident that no transfers could be made to other work projects where road construction is now being proceeded with. However, men who are broadaxemen will be required for culvert work after trails have been made and road construction proceeds.
