Re: Japanese Claims Commission.

We are pleased to advise that we have now completed negotiations with the Custodian on behalf of the Secretary of State with regard to special cases referred to in the report of the Japanese Claims Commission. In your particular case the matter in issue related to compensation for depreciation of your farm while in the hands of the V.L.A.

We have negotiated an award with respect to this matter in the sum of \$1850.00. While we appreciate that this doesn't satisfy your claim as to loss, as we have explained to you in other correspondence, it represents a gain to you which otherwise would not be available. We might say that the figure is considerably higher than what the Custodian was in the first instance prepared to offer and we are satisfied that it is the best settlement which we were able to negotiate.

We are enclosing herewith the special release form which the Custodian requires you to execute with regard to this special award together with an Authority to Pay Fees to the Co-operative Committee on Japanese Canadians. The amount of the fees are shown on the form, being 10%. We trust that you will find the same reasonable.

We would ask you to be good enough to execute the Release and the Authority to Pay Fees at your earliest possible convenience, making sure that the Release is properly witnessed and the Affidavit of Witness taken at the foot of the page. Kindly return this to this office and we will see that they are filed without delay with the Custodian and that


