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Authority Chief's View NEW PORT ACT HAS FINE POSSIBILITIES

Bill C-92, passed in the House of Commons July 26, 1982, is the framework on which to build a truly efficient operating system for Canada's ports, says G.W. (Glenn) McPherson, chairman of the Vancouver Port Authority.

After a decade helping to find new legislation that will provide a wide measure of autonomy for local port administrations, McPherson is pleased with what has emerged. It isn't perfect, he says, but is a long step forward, and should prove extremely beneficial to the ports, their regions and to the federal government itself.

The Act comes into force early in 1983. It will supersede all that has gone before and point the way to a new era in maritime affairs.

McPherson, who is 72, is talking of retiring now that his goal has been attained in large measure. Meanwhile, he has a good many loose ends to look after before the new Act takes over. One of the first problems is an application to establish in Vancouver a local port corporation that will assume many of the duties that have come under National Harbours Board control in Ottawa.

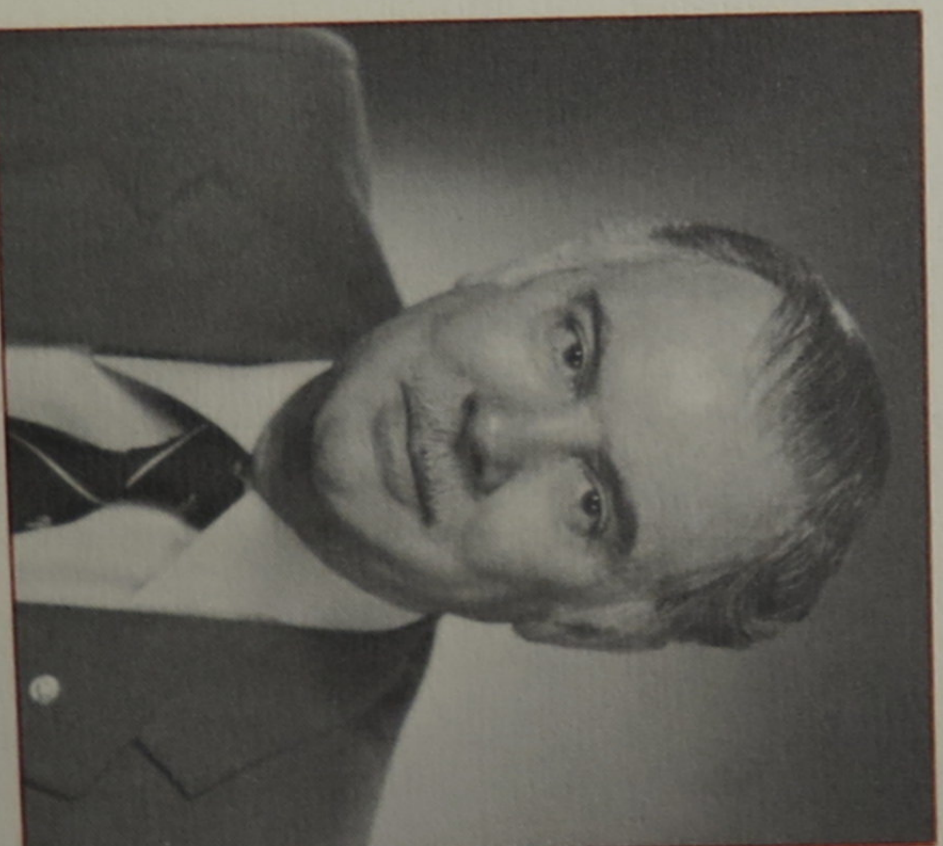
Port Manager Retires After 9 Years

Fred J.N. Spoke will be taking early retirement as General Manager of the Port of Vancouver, effective February 1, 1983.

Mr. Spoke, 62, will have been with the Port of Vancouver nine years as of that date.

"I feel a great attachment to this Port," he said, "but having guided her destiny through nine hectic and often frustrating years, I feel it is time to reduce my workload and enjoy my private life more fully." He will continue to reside in the Vancouver area.

Mr. Spoke said one of his major goals has been to obtain meaningful decision-making powers for local port management. The new Ports Act provides the basis for this. The future of the Port of Vancouver can be very bright indeed. Opportunities are limitless if only all vital elements of the Port community work together effectively, and if governments will recognize what a tremendous asset this Port represents, he said.

After military service as an engineer officer in the Dutch Army in the Caribbean and Southeast Asia, Mr. Spoke came to British Columbia in 1951. Over the period until 1967, he participated at a senior administrative level in many projects connected with hydro and thermal

electric generating development and the pulp and paper industry expansion.

In 1967, he moved to Rotterdam, the largest port in the world. He completed, first, a very extensive building program for the University of Rotterdam and then joined the Port as Deputy Managing Director, a post he held for four years.

He is a member of the Association of Professional Engineers of B.C., The Engineering Institute of Canada, and a number of national and international associations and councils. In 1979, Mr. Spoke was appointed to the Executive Committee of The International Association of Ports and Harbours—the most influential international port organization. In 1981, he was elected a Vice-President of the I.A.P.H.

Mr. Spoke has served also on the Vancouver Economic Advisory Commission, an advisory body to the City of Vancouver Council.

Under the new Act, the federal and senior counterpart — the Canada Ports Corporation — has 18 months in which to present proposals to the Minister and recommendations about the establishment of local port corporations.

"We do not want that sort of delay in Vancouver," says McPherson. "We expect to be among the first to have our own corporation." To this end, as chairman of the existing Authority, he has circulated an information memorandum to councils and other bodies.

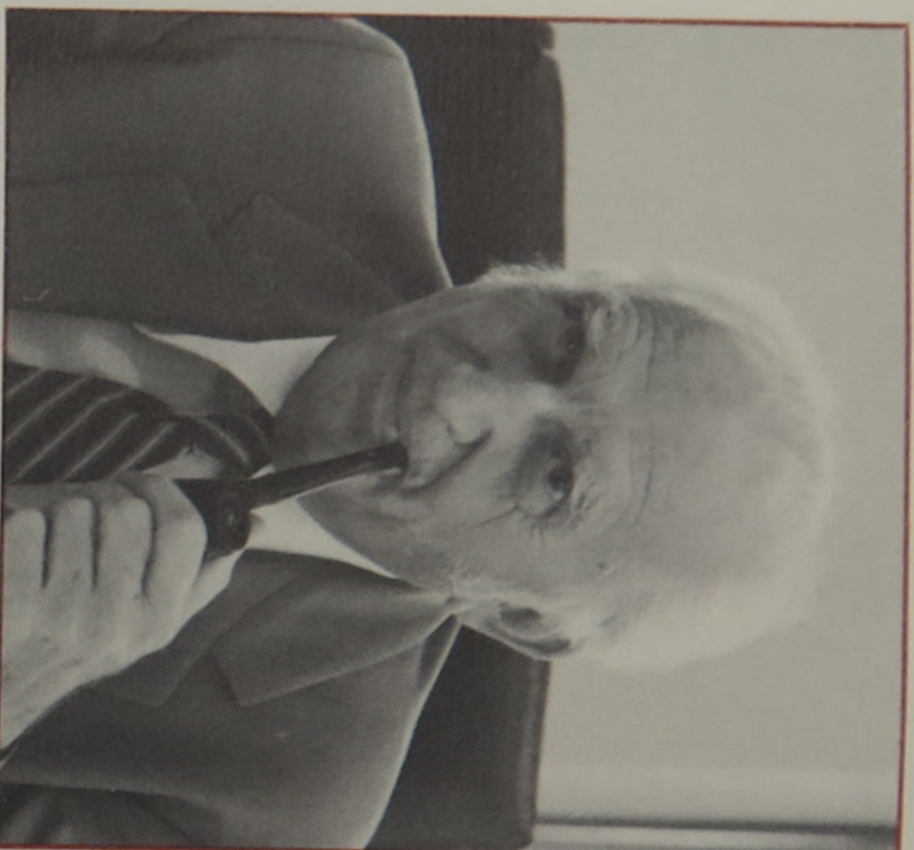
The present Authority, he notes, is "taking the initiative in preparing the necessary material to request that a LPC (local port corporation) be established as soon as possible after proclamation of the Act."

He is asking municipal councils, chambers of commerce, boards of trade and other concerned organizations to support the application with formal messages of backing. Vancouver, he points out, qualifies for LPC status on every count; it is of regional and national significance; there is a demonstrated local interest in the management of the port; the port is likely to be financially solvent, in fact is one of the few in Canada today that has been for many years.

McPherson has been a member of the present Authority since 1971. In that period he was for a long time a member of what was facetiously known as "The Gang of Four", more recently increased to five in number comprising as well the chairmen of the port authorities of Quebec City, Montreal, St. John's, Nfld., and Halifax.

There has been long-standing urging on the part of this group for Ottawa to provide local port autonomy. Under the old regime which now is terminating, there was strict control of NHB ports by Ottawa.

"A task force was set up to develop legislation," McPherson says. "It recommended that all ports be under one commission with local

commissions under it. Some of us objected that this still provided too much opportunity for the Minister to exercise control and direct regulations."

The legislation has emerged, altered a number of times since its initial draft form and still not completely satisfactory to some who have been most deeply concerned, but a vast improvement on most that has gone before.

"The new legislation," says McPherson, "basically is the original bill, as amended in committee, plus some elements of the 1964 Harbour Commission Act".

It provides three new items. The first is the establishment of a 17-person federal corporation, with certain large ports open to operation under a local corporation; and where desired regional advisory councils may be established to advise the Minister.

A minimum of three local Port corporations will be represented on the national corporation board. Ports of all kinds, plus provincial governments, will comprise the membership of regional advisory boards.

The original C-92 draft reserved to the federal corporation the right to transfer from any local port corporation surplus funds for use elsewhere. This clause — and some others — created wide protest including that of "The Gang of Four". In committee, the bill was amended

to in effect establish the national corporation as a banker borrowing funds from one port to another by agreement with the local port corporation.

"I don't see that any large amounts ever will be transferred from Vancouver," McPherson insists. "If we make a profit, and I am not of the belief that the Port is in business to accumulate surplus funds beyond its future requirements, it could be returned to the users in the form of lower fees, or directed to improve the port facilities to the benefit of the users".

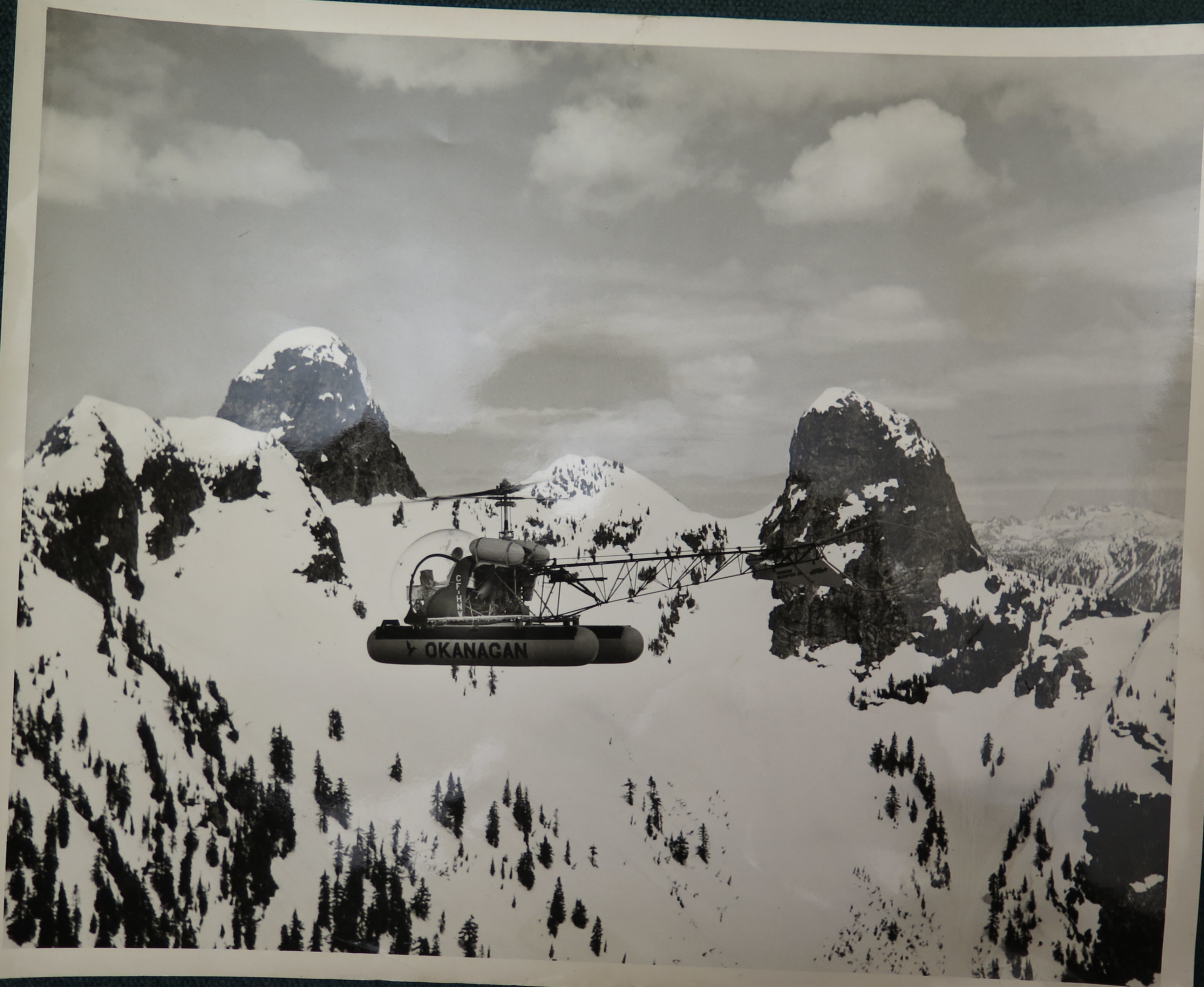
The legislation suggests that the port autonomy under corporations should permit them to authorize expenditures on capital works of up to \$10 million without reference. The sum has to be originally agreed on by Ottawa and the Port, but McPherson expects that Vancouver will be given permission to handle the maximum amount without reference.

Previously, it has had to ask Ottawa for permission to spend more than \$50,000, and the frequent delays of many months that have resulted should henceforth be eliminated.

"Of particular interest to municipalities," says the Chairman, "is that ports will not be able to alter port boundaries without consulting the municipalities involved". While appointments to corporate boards must be made by the Minister, there can be local nominations, and the hunt for useful talent to fill the nomination berths already is under way.

"There is no question," McPherson warns, "that the success or failure of the new system will stand or fall on the quality of the corporation appointees". They must not only be qualified, he adds, but they must be deeply interested.

Under the new system, the port officials who have been NHB employees will become employees of the local corporation. The General Manager of the Port of Vancouver would thus become chief executive officer of the Vancouver corporation answering to the local authority and not the Canada Ports Corporation, McPherson added.



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
