





Your letter of January 20th addressed to Mr. G.E. Collins of the British Columbia Security Commission has been forwarded to us for reply.

As stated in our Mr. McAlister's letter of the 21st December, 1944, to which you refer, your claim against Mr. & Mrs. Tsutomu Ura was disputed by them. This office makes every reasonable effort to collect debts, but if the account is disputed the matter must be settled between the debtor and the creditor.

The correctness of the claim can best be established by yourself and you are at liberty to take any action you may desire to prove and enforce payment of your claim in the same manner that any creditor may do if he so wishes.


In regard to the storage of your chattels. You were very definite about not wanting your goods stored with the Custodian in which case there would have been no amount charged to your account.

Our file indicates that you asked for certain goods to be moved to the Crone Storage and agreed to the expenses involved. In addition to this, at a later date Mr. George E. McCrossan, acting as your Solicitor, authorized the removal of certain furniture to Crone Storage in his letter of December 29th, 1942.

At a later time you desired these goods to be removed to the premises of the Heatley Trading Company, but the Manager who was operating this company on your behalf, refused to accept them claiming that he did not have proper storage space.

If it is not your wish to continue paying charges to the Crone Storage Co. your goods can be removed to one of our own storages. In this event, however, and in accordance with our general policy of liquidation, the goods will be advertised for sale and disposed of at a public auction in the near future.
