



YOUR PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Just about ten years ago, the members of our Association decided on a definite programme with regard to contributions to the Mortuary-Trust Fund and at the same time, it was resolved that a maximum amount of \$1000.00 should be payable with respect to the death of a member.

This Plan is known today as the Original \$1000.00 Plan of Life Protection; and I am proud to be able to say that since the adoption of this Plan, all approved claims have been paid in the full amount of \$1000.00. Without delving too deeply into our records, I feel safe in saying that approximately 500 claims of \$1000.00 each have been paid to date. In addition to this, we have the Group B, Auxiliary, Crescent and Casualty Group claims; reports of which are made each year through this medium.

I want the members of our Association to keep in mind the purpose for which we were instituted—and then carefully scan the other pages of this News Courier and see how closely that purpose is being served. To my mind, in bringing to the several thousands of our members, protection within their means—protection for the past decade that has meant relief from anxiety through want to the dependents of deceased members—it speaks volumes for that small group whose provision was responsible for the policy of our institution.

It is a far cry to the summer of 1924, the year of our institution. I have before me the records of a very humble beginning in the City of New Westminster and since that time, many of our founders have passed to their reward—among them, men and women whose names will long be remembered in that Royal City as well as quite a few in our own.

It is well to reflect once in a while about these pioneers, and also to remember that each Mortuary Trust Fund call is for a definite purpose—the original purpose—that of relieving the husband, wife and other dependents of a deceased member. Once this is kept in mind, no member will ever demur over the payment of these calls, but will find in this Courier good reason to be proud of his membership.

Personally, in this glorious year of peace, I am glad to be alive and able to meet the small demands made on me by our Society and this feeling, I am sure, is shared by all those who have had the anxiety that war brought to most of us. We are now free once again to enjoy fully this coming festival season and I extend to all our members and their friends a very Merry Christmas Season and a Happy, Prosperous New Year in 1947.

TAKE NOTICE that an Extraordinary General Meeting of the members of this Association will be held on Friday, the 30th day of July, A. D. 1948, at the offices of the Association, 515 Granville Street, Vancouver, B. C., at the hour of 2:30 P. M.

This Meeting is called to make changes to the by-laws of the Association to meet certain requirements of the Superintendent of Insurance as provided for by recent legislation. To consider and if deemed advisable to pass the following hereunder amendments to the by-laws of the Association and to pass and confirm the consolidated by-laws as so amended.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO BY-LAWS

PARAGRAPH 5 (d) is amended by striking out all words after the word FUND in line one, and substituting the following: "they may obtain authorization for such payment from the solicitor of the Association".

PARAGRAPH 5 (f) add the following paragraph. The remuneration of the Directors, Officers, Agents, Solicitors, and employees shall be as set forth in Minutes of meetings of the Executive Committee or of the Association.

PARAGRAPH 7 add as follows: (d) A General Reserve Fund. The General Reserve Fund when constituted shall be available, at the discretion of the Executive Committee, for transfers to the Mortuary Trust Fund and to the General Fund for the proper purposes of such Funds.

PARAGRAPH 8 (d) Strike out all the words following the word "Association" in line 6.

PARAGRAPH 8 (e) add the following paragraph. A husband may make application for his wife, or a wife for her husband, or either of the parents for any member of their family.

PARAGRAPH 11 (a) add the following paragraph. When any membership or rights to benefits is suspended or terminated for default in payment of any subscription, due, assessment or other like sum, the member or holder of the contract of membership shall be entitled to have his membership, or rights reinstated upon application within one year from the date of the notice calling for payment of the subscription, due, assessment or other like sum in default and upon payment of all sums overdue and accrued during the period of suspension or termination and upon showing satisfactory evidence of insurability.

PARAGRAPH 11 (b) add the following paragraph. No membership or rights under a contract shall be varied or terminated by reason only that the member or holder of the contract of membership has reached a certain age unless the By-Laws in force at that date when the member so admitted or the contract so made expressly provided for such variation or termination, or unless a resolution approved as to form and content by the Superintendent is submitted to a General Meeting of the members of the Association and passed by a majority of no less than three-fourths of those members present in person or by proxy at such meeting.

PARAGRAPH 18 add the following: The Association shall establish and maintain an advance assessment fund which shall be used only for the payment of claims arising from deaths of members and shall consist of the proceeds of assessments on members or any groups or classes of members made as hereinafter mentioned and the Association shall keep an account for each member showing the assessments paid by him to the Association and the amount disbursed by it in respect of its liability for deaths of members. The Association shall forthwith make such assessment or assessments as will provide in the assessment fund a sum or sums sufficient to pay claims arising from deaths of members, or; will establish from the general reserve fund of the Association in the assessment fund for each group a sum or sums sufficient to pay claims arising from deaths of members in the respective groups according to the following tables:

- (a) In case a group has not more than 1000 members, an amount equal to at least three assessments of the members of that group under the By-Laws of the Association:
- (b) In case a group has more than 1000 and less than 3000 members, an amount equivalent to at least four assessments of the members of that group under the By-laws of the Association:
- (c) In any other case an amount equivalent to at least five assessments in respect of any individual group under the By-laws of the Association.

PARAGRAPH 19 add the following: Whenever the Association has paid claims from the advance assessment fund it shall forthwith if necessary make in the same manner a new assessment or transfer so that the minimum advance assessment fund is maintained. Nothing in this By-law shall exempt the Association from making any other assessment in order to make full payment of a claim or prevent the Association from using any other funds in order to make full payment of any claim, but the provision respecting the advance assessment fund shall be applicable notwithstanding anything in the constitution or By-laws of the Association.

TAKE NOTICE that an Extraordinary General Meeting of the above-named Society will be held at the Registered Office of the Society, namely, No. 6, 342 Pender Street West, VANCOUVER, BRITISH COLUMBIA, on the Tenth day of November, 1948, at the hour of ten o'clock in the forenoon, for the purpose of altering and adding to the By-laws of the Society in the following respects:

1. That By-law No. 3 be amended by striking out the words "and Total Disability dues an additional two dollars (\$2.00) at option of member" where they appear in the second and third lines thereof.

2. That By-law No. 5 be struck out and the following substituted therefor:

"5. Any member failing to comply with By-laws 3 and 4 shall immediately upon default of payment of any subscription, due, assessment or other like sum and being in arrears for at least three (3) months from the date on which the payment was due, stand suspended from and forfeit all membership rights and privileges of the Association without formal notice being given; provided, nevertheless, that before suspension or termination of any membership or rights under a contract, the member shall receive at least two written notices calling for payment and at least one of them shall be sent by registered post requiring an acknowledgment of receipt to be given to the letter carrier in accordance with the regulations of the Post Office."

3. That By-law No. 8 be amended by striking out paragraph (b) thereof.

4. That By-law No. 9 be amended by striking out the words "Mortuary Trust Fund" where they appear and substituting therefor the words "Advance Assessment Fund."

5. That By-law No. 10 be amended by striking out all the words after the word "payment" in the third line thereof.

6. That By-law No. 19 be amended by striking out the words "Mortuary Trust Fund" where they appear and substituting therefor the words "Advance Assessment Fund."

7. That By-law No. 21 be struck out and the following substituted therefor:

"21. The Association shall establish and maintain an "Advance Assessment Fund" which shall be used only for the payment of claims arising from deaths of members and shall consist of the proceeds of assessments on members or any groups or classes of members made as hereinafter mentioned and the Association shall keep an account for each member showing the assessments paid by him to the Association and the amount disbursed by it in respect of its liability for death of members. The Association shall forthwith make such assessment or assessments as will provide in the assessment fund a sum or sums sufficient to pay claims arising from deaths of members, or will establish from the reserve funds of the Association in the assessment fund for each group a sum or sums sufficient to pay claims arising from deaths of members in the respective groups according to the following table:

"A" In case a group has not more than 1000 members, an amount equal to at least three assessments of the members of that group under the By-laws of the Association;

"B" In case a group has more than 1000 and less than 3000 members, an amount equivalent to at least four assessments of the members of that group under the By-laws of the Association;

"C" In any other case an amount equivalent to at least five assessments in respect of any individual group under the By-laws of the Association; And all other moneys shall be placed to the credit of the General Fund of the Association."

8. By-law No. 22 is struck out and the By-laws of the Association are further amended by inserting the following as 22, 22(a) and 22(b):

"22" Whenever the Association has paid claims it shall forthwith, if necessary, make in the same manner a new assessment so that the minimum advance assessment fund is maintained. Nothing in this By-law shall exempt the Association from making any other assessment in order to make full payment of a claim or prevent the Association from using any other funds in order to make full payment of any claim, but the provision respecting the advance assessment fund shall be applicable notwithstanding anything in the Constitution or By-laws of the Association."

"22(a). When any membership or rights to benefits is suspended or terminated for default in payment of any subscription, due, assessment or other like sum, the member or holder of the contract of membership shall be entitled to have his membership or rights reinstated upon application within one year from the date of the notice calling for payment of the subscription, due, assessment or other like sum in default and upon payment of all sums overdue and accrued during the period of suspension or termination and upon showing satisfactory evidence of insurability."

"22(b). No membership or rights under a contract shall be varied or terminated by reason only that the member or holder of the contract of membership has reached a certain age unless the By-laws in force at that date when the member so admitted or the contract so made expressly provided for such variation or termination, or unless a resolution approved as to form and content by the Superintendent is submitted to a General Meeting of the members of the Association and passed by a majority of no less than three-fourths of those members present in person or by proxy at such meeting."

9. By-law No. 46 is hereby struck out.

10. By-law No. 48 is hereby amended by striking out the words "Mortuary Trust Fund" where they appear and substituting in lieu thereof the words "General Fund."

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED:

1. That the Release of the Secretary's contract, made between "JAMES E. RICE" and the Association dated on or about the Seventh day of May, 1932, be and the same is hereby approved and that in future the Secretaries be retained on a monthly salary basis and all funds of the Association be deposited into the Bank Account of the Association as provided in the By-laws.

2. That an Auditor, having an office and carrying on business in the Province of British Columbia be appointed to audit the financial affairs of the Association pursuant to the terms of the "Societies Act."
