ANNUAL MEETING, VANCOUVER HOUSING ASSOCIATION
March 30, 1949

RESOLUTIONS

1. DOMINION-PROVINCIAL CONFERENCE (Moved by Mr. Oscar Erickson)

WHEREAS the people of Canada will shortly be called upon to go to the polls in a Federal election;

WHEREAS it is important that they should know the programs of all the political parties;

WHEREAS the opposition parties in Parliament have already declared that they favour an immediate Dominion-Provincial meeting, to include all the provinces, to discuss a housing program for Canada;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that we urge the present Government to declare its intentions in ~~this matter~~ ^{the Low Rental Housing} without delay.

2. DOMINION GOVERNMENT HOUSING COORDINATION (Moved by Mr. Jocelyn Davidson)

WHEREAS at the present time the jurisdiction over housing matters is divided between the Department of Reconstruction and Supply and the Department of Finance, a situation which results in confusion and lack of coordination;

WHEREAS the inclusion of Wartime Housing and also of Housing Enterprises under the Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation has already demonstrated some of the advantages of unified administration;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that all housing jurisdiction, including rent control and low-rent housing, should be consolidated under the Minister of Reconstruction and Supply.

3. LOCAL HOUSING AUTHORITIES (Moved by Mrs. Grace MacInnis)

WHEREAS it has been amply demonstrated by United States experience that a properly constituted Local Housing Authority is essential for the efficient management of low-rent and slum clearance projects in cities;

WHEREAS the Local Housing Authority has been repeatedly endorsed by the Canadian Federation of Mayors and Municipalities as the means by which cities and towns may most effectively organize their participation in a national low-rental housing program, with provincial and federal participation;

WHEREAS many cities, including Vancouver, are contemplating setting up Local Housing Authorities; but there is no provision for their participation under the National Housing Act;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Dominion Government be requested to correct this situation immediately by the insertion of the words "Local Housing Authority" in the relevant Sections of the National Housing Act.
