

RAILWAY TO BUILD NETWORK OF LINES THROUGH PROVINCE

Kettle Valley Will Apply to Parliament for Permission to Lease Its Lines to the Canadian Pacific, Which Plans to Construct Large Number of Roads Through the Interior of British Columbia.

(Ottawa, Nov. 15.—The Kettle Valley Railway company will apply to parliament at the approaching session for authority to lease its lines to the C. P., which proposes to construct the following lines:
