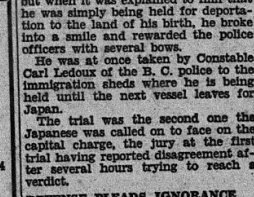
DRASTIC CUT IN CIVIC WORKS DEPT.

BATTLE OF THE WETS AND DRYS

WASHINGTON, April 3.—Wets and drys testifying before the judicial committee of the House of Representatives on prohibition have presented an illuminating array of facts for and against the United States bone dry law.

Lives Saved, State Drys

Prohibitionists defending the law stated:
1. Between \$2,000,000,000 and \$5,000,000,000 a year, formerly spent for liquor, is now going into ordinary business channels.
2. The institution of the saloon is gone forever. The breweries and the distilleries are gone.
3. Commitments for crime have decreased 37 per cent.

Crime Increased, Assert Wets

The wets refused to agree with either statistics or deductions. On their part they declared with equal emphasis:
1. No important economic change has taken place.
2. Secret speakeasies and illicit stills have replaced the open saloon.
3. Crime has increased.
4. Insurance statistics show an increase in deaths from alcoholism of 600 per cent.

MARX JOHN MINES COMPANY PROPERTIES DISCOUNTED BY STATE EXPERT



SAN FRANCISCO, April 3.—State investigation into the claims of radium-bearing ores from California mines have been made recently, it is reported here, and attention has been particularly given to the reported discovery of radium in the property of the Marx-John Mines company, in Calaveras county. Considerable publicity has been given to the Marx-John claims in this city during the past month.

CALIFORNIA TO PROBE RADIUM ORE CLAIMS

According to Mr. W. W. Bradley, state mineralogist, the Marx-John property was visited by a representative of the mining division last October and no evidence of any radium-bearing ore was found. Samples tested in state laboratories were declared blank so far as radium or any other rare earth metals were concerned.
Claims of Mr. John T. Martin, president of the company, that radium is extracted from the ore by a secret electrical process in which 3,500,000 volts are developed from the ordinary electrical supply of the state were denied by Professor Joseph Snyder Carroll of Stanford university, who believed that such power would not be possible and would not be used commercially even if developed.
Other scientific views in the state look upon the electrical claims with considerable doubt.
