Religious Use of Holidays SAYS wise Dean Inge, "The soul is dyed the color of its leisure thoughts."

Seasonal leisure is again with us and the soul dyeing process in camp again on sea shores, on mountain trail and in auto, goes on again with accelerated pace.

One of the problems of religious leadership has been to secure work free leisure, to drive back aversion and to provide for a weekly renewal from the most dull of the week's Sabbatic pause.

The granting of leisure is the education of the people to its profitable use and a never-ceasing campaign which the new holiday season brings into view again at this time of the year.

The machine has taken on the spirit of the age and its presence has become a necessary and to whom there will come within perhaps the present generation a five-day week, but in leisure we are convinced; it is only that a true character appears.

The commercial instincts of the age are busy selling mechanical and trust-to-buy religious concoctions. Does the volume of it and the lawlessness of it argue the tableness of the average human and soul created and re-created as it is?
