Tragedy of a married love took a toll of two lives in the Japanese section of the city this morning, the serially stabbing the girl to death, seriously wounding her mother and then to her aid, then committing a form of hari kari.

Principals in the tragedy which was enacted in a Japanese rooming house at 538 Alexander Street were: DEAD: Miss Emi Oike, 14, Trunkton Yoida, 34. WOUNDED: Mrs. Sun O. Oike.

Mrs. Oike is recovering in the General Hospital from a severe wound in the left forearm and five knife wounds on the head and neck. Dr. Shimo Takahara, attending her, states that her condition is not serious.

Second Game for Cup Proves See-Saw Struggle

WESTBURY, N. Y., Sept. 18.—England was beaten 14 to 9 by the U. S. here today in the second and final game for the international polo cup. The victory gave the U. S. the title.

By ALAN GOULD Associated Press Sports Editor WESTBURY, N. Y., Sept. 10.—Beneath a brilliant but heat-dome of an almost cloudless sky, American and British polo teams galloped into action this afternoon in the second match of the classic series for the International Cup.

Another big crowd turned out, but the stands were only partially full, with about 25,000 spectators on hand when play began.

After two U. S. attacks had failed, with one long drive by Hitchcock going over the back line, the challenge turned the ball toward the Yankees goal.
