4 HOBOES PERISH IN BLAZING CARS

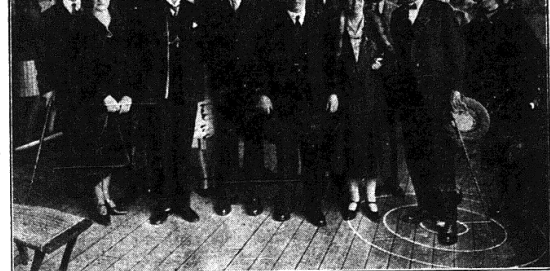
