

MONTREAL, Oct. 1.—Unconfirmed reports said to the effect that Canada Power and Paper would take over Dryden Paper Company in a merger exchange. It was also reported that the exchange would consist of two-thirds of the former for three of the latter. This was as yet unconfirmed, and while Canada Power had been in touch with the company during the past few months in connection with the
