**Perfection of Home Fee is Ably Traced**  
Optimistic Speech Delivered by Douglas Kerr to Credit Men

A heartening speech showing that Canadian courage and character are as operative today as in the pioneer age was made Wednesday at the luncheon of the Canadian Credit Men's Trust Association in the Hotel Georgia, by Douglas Kerr of the Canadian Life Assurance Co.

This tall, outspoken Scotloman, who deprecates pessimism, declared: "The home today is not in course of disintegration. You have seen in your own homes, in the homes of your friends, in our world, that is the desire, the determination to buy as soon as possible the best that life has to offer."

"There has been no diminution in the capacity to build in the home. He may be facing difficulties, but he is determined to get the best of education through the mass of psychological factors which terminate in the home-building stage and an ultimate improvement of the environment and perfection of the home."

**THE AGES OF MAN**  
"What controls economic trend?" he asked. "From fifteen to twenty-five the young man is a large exclamation mark. From twenty-five to thirty-five he is a great question mark. He asks where he is going in life. Between thirty-five and forty he is accumulating responsibility. It is three years before he realizes he cannot throw them off. Stability enters him. He begins to understand that refusal to bear responsibilities would make him just a tramp."

"The years between forty and forty-five are devoted by him, usually, to the consolidation of his affairs. It is at this age he may be tempted by J. Edgar Wallace's offering him the gold-brick, but ninety-seven per cent of our men get-rich-quick schemes fail by the wayside."

"From forty-five to fifty, there are still the burdens plus the added knowledge that he must make good. Only one out of five thousand comes back after fifty."

**HOPE OF FUTURE**  
"Do not fear what your business, everything is made necessary by the acquisition by the average Canadian of the home. And you cannot today, whatever the economic situation, take any step that has been pointed up to the average family. The standard of life is there a fact. That is what controls the economic situation here, right here, in Vancouver. That is the hope for the future. We can see clearly the determination of men and women. Ideas are so ambitious as ever before and we can look the world in the face knowing that nothing is altered and it is not going to alter."

**CHICAGO, Nov. 20.**—The Government took Jack Quirk out of the beer business last night, winning a conviction before a United States District Court jury on three counts. The maximum penalty on each count is five years imprisonment and a \$10,000 fine. The applicable charge against him was that he evaded payments of income tax aggregating \$22,000.

**WATERWAYS PLAN HIT**  
**CHICAGO, Nov. 20.**—A resolution recommending combative measures to defeat the international waterways plan of the present Congress and urging Federal regulation and taxation of other carrier systems in the same manner that railroads are now governed, was adopted by five railway brotherhoods.

## Addition for 'The Abbey'



A contract for an addition to The Abbey Mausoleum and Columbarium has been let to the E. J. Ryan Contracting Company. The new addition will consist of 176 crypts. The work will start immediately. This will be an appendage to the present building now under construction and rapidly nearing completion. It will be constructed of reinforced concrete and will be finished with marble, pre-cast stone, bronze and art glass and faced with granite, all in keeping with the present structure. This work is being done under the cost plus system and is estimated to cost in the neighborhood of \$75,000. Above is seen a typical corridor in The Abbey.

**B.C. FARMERS TOLD OF NEW LAND SALES**  
**VICTORIA, Nov. 20.**—Colonization and settlement, Oriental penetration of Canada, Australian imports and many other subjects were discussed by the Advisory Board of British Columbia Farmers' Institutes at its meeting today.

A round table discussion of colonization and settlement matters was held with Dr. W. H. Geddes and Col. W. S. Latta. There had been a big increase in the sale of land under all Government departments this year, including sales in the Burns area.

The meeting adopted a general resolution, which would press strict enforcement of existing immigration laws affecting Orientals.

**Two U.S. Parties Agree to Truce**  
**WASHINGTON, Nov. 20.**—A limited truce for the period of the coming short session of the present Congress has been arranged between the Democratic and Republican floor leaders of the Senate.

Under its terms there is to be Democratic co-operation with the Republicans in passing the annual appropriation bills for the support of the government for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1931.
