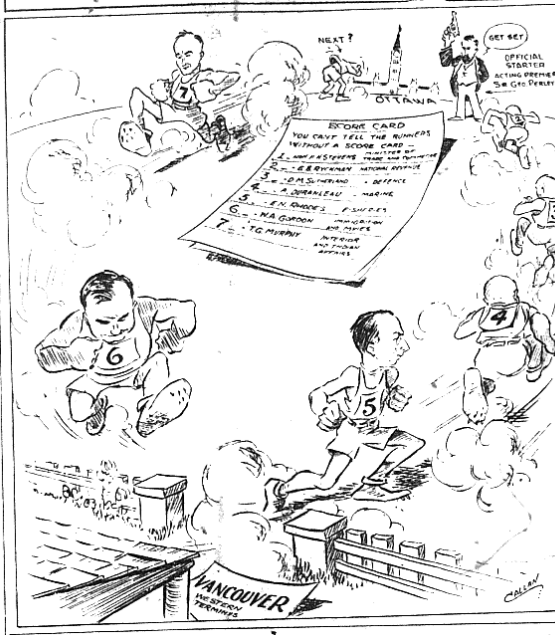

BULK OF VANCOUVER PAYROLL SPENT ON FOOD AND CLOTHING

207 Millions Spent in 1928 of Which 59 Millions Went for Eatables and 50 Millions for Apparel—Optimistic Report

This is shown specifically by the analysis of trade volume for Greater Vancouver. The two major items combined amounted to over one-half of the volume of business for 1928 and it is estimated that 1930 returns will be about in line with those of that year.
