

Fraser Bridge Location Row Rises Again

Ladner Interests Seek Rights for Toll Span

VICTORIA, Nov. 25.—An arrangement that application by financially responsible interests has been made for permission to build a privately owned toll bridge across the Fraser River at Ladner.

While the final word on this proposal must necessarily come from Ottawa with regard to the crossing of navigable waters the province is interested in the question of high-way approaches.

No government expenditure on a bridge at Ladner is likely for some years. It is considered to be giving consideration to being given to construction of another Fraser bridge upstream from New Westminster to relieve the traffic congestion on the present structure.

OLD CHARTER REVIVED Armstrong, Morrison & Co., contractors, who obtained one of two charters from the city for a toll bridge at Ladner, are believed to be the applicants in the present instance.

BONDS UNPOPULAR Financial men state that they do not believe private bridge bonds could be successfully floated at the present time, as they have lost the popularity of the market that prevailed several years ago.

Presumption that one of the two toll charters granted by the Legislature for construction of a privately owned toll bridge is involved in the new proposal for a bridge across the Fraser at Ladner was expressed by Leon J. Ladner, president of the International Bridge Company at Detroit, one of the largest private bridge companies on the continent.

TOLL SPANS PAY Operators with toll bridges had proved highly satisfactory, he said, users of the bridge paying tolls, and toll bridges in America, he stated, have succeeded as the original promoters had offered commutation tickets at a reduced rate.
