YOUNG HOLDUP MAN SENTENCED TO TWO YEARS

Poind guilty of holding up the Japanese proprietor of a grocery store at the corner of Homer and Robson Streets, the night of September 11, and robbing him of \$4 and some cigarettes, Thomas Cawley, 21, was sentenced by Judge Cawley Wood, yesterday afternoon to two years in New Westminster penitentiary.

With two companions, Cawley hired a taxi and after driving to the Howe Street liquor store, stopped the taxi near the grocery. There Cawley got out and, it was alleged by the crown, undressed the Japanese by holding his hand in his pocket as if he had a watch.

Miss Edith Pike, who said she and Clorin Smith were the other two passengers in the taxi with Cawley, said when he stopped the taxi he simply informed them that he intended calling on a friend. He refused to give names and told the driver to drive on.

WITNESS DISAPPEARS

A witness who had been issued for Martin's arrest when he failed to appear as a crown witness, but a C. Woodbury crown prosecutor, informed the court the police had been unable to locate him.

"One doesn't know what to do in a case like yours," said Judge Cawley. "If, as has been suggested, there was a labor battalion, where would you better than sending you to jail. But there isn't, so I sentence you to two years, the penitentiary."

Outstanding Results of Chinese Civil Warfare

SHANGHAI, Nov. 28.—Some results of the recent, and generally regarded as China's most serious civil war, which has been fought since the First Revolution in 1911, are listed below.

- 1—Broken the political and military power and prestige of Gen. Yen Hsi-shan, regarded in some quarters as China's model provincial governor.
- 2—Reduced the number of major military leaders in the country to two, Gen. Chiang Kai-shek and Marshal Chang Hsiang-shan.
- 3—Killed and wounded probably more than 50,000 soldiers.
- 4—Discouraged any future attempt at military intervention by the Maritime Customs Administration.
- 5—Led to great increase in "red" bandits also through breaking up of Northern armies to great increase in unemployed parasitic elements in population.
- 6—Definitely established Nanking as the Capital of the Republic, as Gen. Yen Hsi-shan made free use of the prestige of the old capital as a political slogan for stirring up the Northern people against the South.
- 7—Made it necessary for the Government to increase and reorganize the Customs duties as a means of raising funds for paying for the war.
- 8—Made it necessary for the Government to reorganize and modernize

domestic taxation for reasons similar to those stated in No. 16.

Currency Problems

18—Caused Western businessmen and financiers to finally give serious attention to the matter of assisting China in the solution of her currency and financial problems as a means of restoring foreign trade in the Pacific area.

19—Further acquired the entire country with the minuscule of Soviet intrigue and emphasized the importance of developing a strong central government as a means of opposing foreign intrigue and aggression.

20—Probably made necessary a reorganization of the Nanking Cabinet in order to bring in Northern political influence as a means of preventing a future clash between Nanking and Mukden.

21—Made it more difficult for any militant or group of militants to start another rebellion against the recognized government.

22—Probably resulted in the early opening of the North-South rail-line, long closed to through transportation, also probably resulted in greatly stimulating air-transportation due to the practical training of many new Chinese aviators in war service.

23—Wholesale training of Chinese officials to have considerable moral effect upon both Japan and Russia, potential military enemies of China in the future.

24—Stimulated greatly the necessity

Still others are like the snowdrops and crocuses, which wait their chance to spring beauty, as if they dared not waste their substance on brilliant color before their early warmth may save all their energies.

Some have been or some economy Nature had granted to each of these brave adventurers, that dare to bloom in the crisp spring air.


