FIRM SECURES CONTRACT FOR C.P.R. TUNNEL

Vancouver's fight for more than 15 years to obtain a C.P.R. tunnel eliminating seven grade crossings in the downtown area was considered by the board with the letting of contract by the Canadian Pacific Railway to the British Construction Company and J. W. Stewart.
Actual construction, estimated to cost \$1,250,000, will start at the beginning of the New Year and will require more than 100 men for 18 months, it is reported.
The tunnel will be ready for use by March 31, 1932, just 15 months after the date set in the order of the Board of Railway Commissioners, dated June 7, 1929.
The tunnel, as now planned will have its northern portal at the foot of Thurlow Street on Burrard Inlet.
It will follow a wide easterly arc to Dunsmuir Street, east of Dunsmuir Street, where it will swing to Canada Street, and thence south to debouch on the C.P.R. Creek yards at a point just south of and beneath the Victoria Viaduct.
By its use, grade crossings at Alexander, Carrall, Hastings, and Pender Streets will be eliminated.
The tunnel route will be 6140 feet, 4160 feet of which will be underground. This will include 1000 feet of rock, shale and sandstone. Total cost, including damage to property, is estimated at slightly less than \$1,200,000.
The city of Vancouver and the C.P.R. have been ordered to bear equal portions of the cost, namely \$600,000 each. The British Columbia Electric, which benefits by eradication of the grade crossings, will pay \$450,000, and contributions from the Federal level crossing fund and the city \$300,000 will be forthcoming.
