'Loose Ends' is the brilliant dialogue version of the remarkable stage play of the same name by Dion Boucicault, which ran at the Dominion Theatre last night.

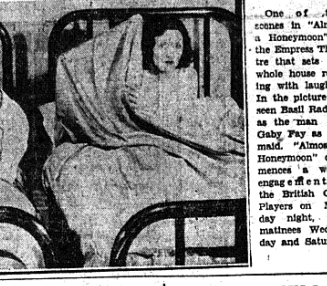

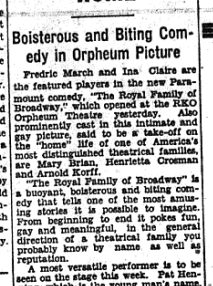
