PROVINCIAL LIST REVISION NEEDED

Federal Vote Given 330,000 People, B.C. 198,000

(By Sun Staff Correspondent) VICTORIA, March 2.—Demand for radical alterations in British Columbia's Electoral Act has brought out the anomaly that if a Provincial election were held in the near future the number of persons entitled to vote would be only a little more than half those who were entitled to vote at the Dominion election last summer, although the qualifications are the same.

Under the enumeration system employed by the Dominion last summer the names of 322,949 persons were enrolled on the voters list.

The Provincial voters list at present contains only 182,444 names.

In the Provincial constituency of South Vancouver there are only 5900 names on the Provincial list, but the Dominion list within that area contained 22,128 names.

In Richmond-Point Grey the Dominion enumeration found 27,421 persons entitled to vote. In a Provincial election held at the present time only 9228 of these would be able to exercise their franchise.
