\$53,000,000 PROGRAM FOR **BUILDING HERE**

Many Major Projects Well Advanced; Others Starting; Home Construction Adds Millions

Greater Vancouver is well launched on a \$52,000,000 construction program for this year. The table below shows graphically its significance and the progress made on it.

Major projects on the tapis for this year are listed below. Many already are started, while preliminaries for others are under way and actual construction is scheduled to begin shortly.

With contracts totalling \$4,500,000 already let on the \$5,000,000 Canadian National Railways hotel, the framework of which now towers over all other structures in the "high building" area, it is estimated that approximately \$4,500,000 has yet to be spent on this undertaking.

Railway development by the Canadian Pacific Canadian National and B. C. Electric holds a prominent place in this year's construction program, combuting approximately \$15,000,000 to the total of \$53,2700,000 Burrard bridge, also adds considerably to the total.
