**ABOLITION OF POULTRY DEPT. IS INDICATED**

Provincial Gov't Dismisses All Officials Making No Provision for Work

NEW WESTMINSTER, March 31.—Abolition of the poultry section of agriculture is indicated in the dismissal of the commissioner and inspectors, advice on which was received here today from Hon. William Aikman, minister of agriculture.

Notices of dismissal have been received by department officials and it is stated, individuals concerned including James Allen, inspector for Fraser Valley and Fraser Valley; H. E. Wabey and D. Landon, inspectors for Okanagan and Kootenay respectively, and J. R. Terry, poultry commissioner, were set up under Liberal regime nearly a decade ago in the raising and care of fowls and give special attention to newsmen in the raising and care of fowls.

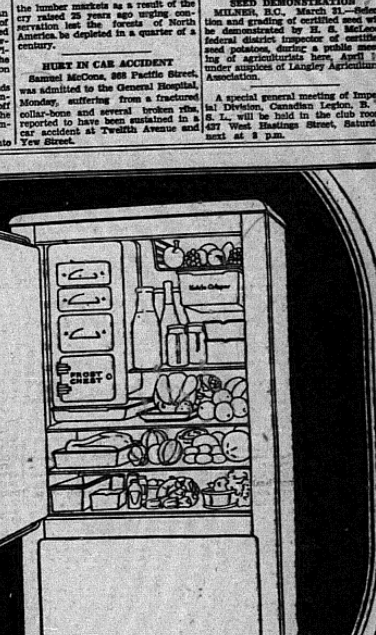
