2 BANDIT SUSPECTS CAPTURED

Bankers Identify Pair in Police Line-up

Picked from a line-up at city police headquarters Friday as men resembling the two armed bandits who held up P. J. Roche, manager, and G. C. Johnston, teller, in the Vancouver branch of the Bank of Montreal at about 9 a.m. Thursday, Thomas Nelson, 4150 East Hastings Street, and Henry Portier, 440 West 10th Avenue, were identified by the two bank officials as the men who were in the line-up. The two men were taken to the police station pending their preliminary hearing on a charge of robbery with violence.

Acting on information received from Detective D. Maxwell and Fred J. Roche, Constable C. J. O'Neil and Constable D. Maxwell of the Burnaby force, arrested a three-caravan truck at 4150 East Hastings Street Thursday afternoon, after a walk-in several hours, saw Nelson enter. The three officers approached the truck from different directions, entered and placed Nelson under arrest at 8 p.m.

HAD TWO GUNS
When arrested Nelson, one of which was identified as being one of the pair taken by the two bandits from the bank. Nelson was questioned by officers, Nelson declared to have refused to make any statement regarding his alleged accomplice.
