from examination of the drugs found on Sakurada's Cordova Street premises after the police searched the place on April 1. It is understood that an analysis is being made of the drugs to ascertain whether they contain disease germs.

While detective kept invisible the wall of secrecy which has been built up around the alleged "murder factory" investigation, feeling in the Japanese community was running high.

Sakurada came from a province in Japan whose natives are a small minority among the 5000 population of the city among the Japanese. Except to the relatively few local Japanese who came from this part of the Orient, he was little known in the community.

JAPANESE RESENTFUL
The great majority in the local Japanese community are resentful because of the publicity arising out of the investigation, considering it an unfavorable reflection upon the people of their race.

Rumors were current yesterday that physical action was being planned against Sakurada. The man was being kept under close surveillance, and a second appearance in court for preliminary hearing within the next few weeks, special police precautions will be taken to guard them. It is stated.

Whether the police fear an attempted delivery or an attack upon Sakurada, they would not state.

EXHUMATION POSTPONED
Examination of records in three local insurance offices is continuing under the direction of Special Officer Hitchens. It is expected that within a few days the police will be possessed of a full list of insured Japanese who died in Vancouver during the last three years.

Chief Hitchens has announced that he was postponing his request to the attorney general for permission to exhumate the bodies of three Japanese until further information has been obtained.

FREEZE OF JOY
Bedlam broke loose when the victory was registered. Bombs and bullets added to the din, but they were fired harmlessly into the heavens. Until then, it was the quietest election day in Chicago.

Thompson, forcing a walk smile, congratulated his victorious opponent, then announced he would still work for the good of Chicago, "redeeming my efforts for completion of the waterways to bring Chicago a greater prosperity."

HISTORY RECALLED
Thirty-one years ago, Thompson, a young man of ample means, came from the western prairie, a go-getter, won his way to the city council.

In 1915 he was elected mayor, disclosed huge bundles of pledge-cards, and announced immediately that he was a socialist. "The older political heads laughed uproariously."

Drive the crooks out of this town," was his slogan. He was elected. In 1919 he repeated his victory. "Freedom for Ireland" pledge, and criticized U. S. entry in the war. Then he stepped to one side, but in 1927 he returned white-haired Mayor Dewey.

He was elected again, but in 1931 he was defeated by the first 12 wards tabulated stood by Thompson. That was "Punchy" Thompson, a bloodthirsty and wholesale fraudster three years ago—the ward of Morris Miller, mob boss, ally of "Big Bill" and city collector. His ward went for Thompson by 1000.

REFRAL IN AGREED
Renewal of the Colonial Laws Validity Act insofar as Canada is concerned was agreed, subject to the provisions of the British North America Act.

Announcement was made by Mr. Hon. R. B. Bennett, prime minister, that at some future date a constitutional conference for consideration of conditions under which the British North America Act may be amended will take place.

Decisions applicable to Canada for inclusion in the new Statute of Westminster was announced by Mr. Bennett, who was left over until representatives of the provincial governments have an opportunity to consult their colleagues.

FRAUD ACT SOUGHT
OTTAWA, April 8.—Seeking power over Dominion incorporated companies, provincial delegates attending the Dominion-Provincial Conference are making representations toward this end to the Federal Government today.

Proposed action arises out of the decision of the Supreme Court in the Alberta Fraud Securities Act ultra vires in part and restraining the attorney general of that province from investigating two oil companies functioning under Dominion charters.

ACTION REQUESTED
VICTORIA, April 8.—Federal action has been requested by B. C. in regard to the verification of Security Forces Canada, Attorney General H. H. Poonis said here today. Poonis declared it had been foreseen for some time that Dominion companies could be subject only to Dominion control, and added that no repercussions were feared in B. C. on that score.
