Papers seized in the raid disclose that the sweep was to have totalled \$1,500,000 with \$400,000 in prises. Envelopes addressed to 5000 cities in the United States which presumably were to have been used in sending stokets for sale there, were seized as well as hundreds of thousands of tickets.
