FIRST TIME SINCE MONARCH'S ILLNESS

LONDON, June 5.—The King, for the first time since his serious illness in 1926, took the salute at the troops of the color at the Horse Guards parade today in observance of his fifty-sixth birthday anniversary. The ceremony was postponed from Wednesday so that he could attend the Derby at Epsom.

His Majesty was a resplendent figure in a scarlet and gold uniform with the broad blue ribbon of the Garter across his breast.

He was back again among his soldiers as he sat motionless on the big bay charger to take the salute, and the cheers which greeted his arrival were a testimonial of the pleasure of his people at seeing him astride a horse at a public function once again.

Long before the King appeared, distant cheering heralded his approach down the Mall. Then the royal procession entered the parade ground in Whitehall where the Guardsmen were drawn up in two faultless lines.
