OTTAWA, June 11.—Toronto brokers, convicted and sentenced to prison, are located at the Federal Jail, Kingston, Ont. Ron, Hugh, Arthur, and William, who told the House of Commons yesterday. The superintendent of penitentiaries had seen these convicted brokers and had personally interviewed each one. They were employed on cement mixers, fixing a barn, carpenter work, digging ditches, in garden work and the like.
