German Revolution Averted By Debt Agreement Success; New London Parley Called

PARIS, July 7.—The text of the war debt moratorium accord, approved by France and the United States, is as follows:

After exchanges of views, the French Government states that it is in agreement with the United States on the essential principle of President Hoover's proposal and on the following proposition which may be expressed thus:

First.—The payment of inter-governmental debts is postponed from July 1, 1931, to June 30, 1932.

Second.—However, the Reich will pay the amount of the inter-governmental annuity. The payments there made shall be placed by the Danubian International Settlements in bonds guaranteed by the German railways.

Third.—The suspended payments shall be subject to interest in accordance with the conditions stipulated in the American Government's memorandum, payable in ten annual instalments beginning with July 1, 1932.
