## \$100,000 FINE END OF BROKER CASE?

### Termination of Soloway-Mills Action Intimated

Fine of \$100,000 imposed on the brokerage firm of Soloway, Mills & Co. Ltd. by Judge J. N. Mills, Tuesday, may result in a definite stay of further criminal proceedings against F. W. O. Soloway and Harvey Mills, the two heads of the firm.

While the conspiracy charge against them has been adjourned indefinitely, no instructions regarding the next step have been received by A. H. MacNeill, K.C., leading counsel in the case. Mr. MacNeill stated today that he would make a formal report to the attorney general's department and

await word before making any other move.

Outcome of the charge against the firm, which resulted in immediate payment of the fine, while said to be regarded with satisfaction by the attorney general's department, is not viewed with any great amount of exuberance by former clients who have started suits against the firm.

These plaintiffs know they will not receive one cent of any fine paid by the brokers toward settlement of any claim they may establish, and also that the more money collected in fines from the firm lessens any chance they may have had of realizing on their claims.

## BRITAIN BUYING CANADA APPLES

### Record Shipment Made to Old Country in 1930

LONDON, July 8.—The world-wide economic depression has not arrested the growing habit in the United Kingdom of buying within the Empire.

The annual report of the Empire Marketing Board reveals that apples from Canada and New Zealand reached a record quantity in the past year, those from Canada exceeding two million hundredweight against a previous record of 1,830,000 hundredweight in 1929. In 1930 6,400 hundredweight of Canadian

years were imported, as compared with 60,000 in 1928.

Parliament has been asked to provide \$2,000,000 for the board's activities during the coming 12 months. The policy of making grants for scientific research work both here and abroad is being continued.

## Opposition Majority in Upper House Brings Crisis

SYDNEY, New South Wales, July 8.—The dispute between the Government of New South Wales and Sir Philip Game, governor of the state, has spread to both houses of the state parliament.

The legislature by a vote of 51 to 31 after an all-night sitting, passed a motion declaring it was the business of the governor to accept and act upon the advice of his ministers when such ministers held the confidence of the legislative assembly, and that he should not act upon the advice that a sufficient number of persons nominated by the government should be summoned by the Legislative Council (upper house) to ensure passage of necessary financial and other matters.

Sir Philip has consistently declined to approve the premier's nominees to the Upper House.

While Sir Philip, following a rider to the motion, has called in the Secretary of State for Dominion Affairs at London, the Upper House took a hand in the matter in order to constitute a motion before the Legislature, the Legislative Council adopted a motion endorsing its own rejection of the emergency income tax bill and asserting the right of the governor to exercise his discretion when he is asked to make appointments to the Upper House.

The legislative council motion further declares the Upper House had the right and the duty to protect the people of New South Wales against "abuse of power," and the power to reject and amend measures not approved by the electors. It concludes with a request to the President of the Council to convey the resolution to the Governor for transmission to the Dominion secretary.

Premier J. T. Lang came into power as head of a labor ministry last October. Since then he has been handicapped in the attempted passage of a number of extreme measures by an opposition majority in the Upper House, and for many months has been endeavoring to get enough members appointed to the chamber to either give the government a majority or else vote the chamber out of existence.

The council recently ruled that abolition of the Upper House, however, was a matter for submission to the people by means of a referendum.

Matters were brought to a head a few days ago when the Upper House threw out the drastic "emergency income tax bill."

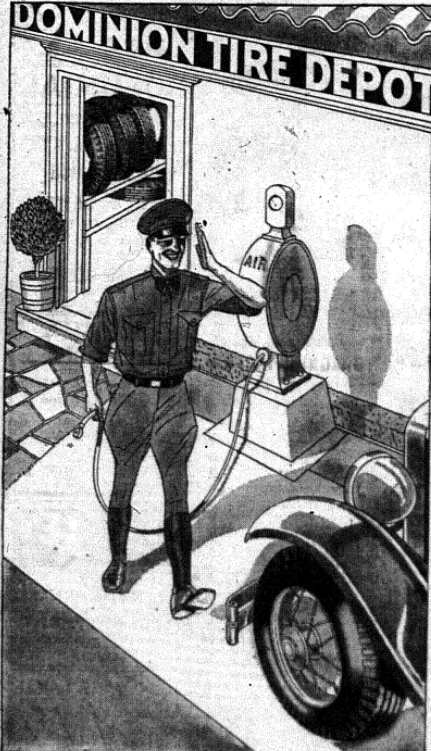

**DISCOVERY OF NEW STAR ACCIDENTAL**  
RICHMOND, N.J., July 8.—Astronomers of the new star discovered Monday by the Royal Observatory was shown today by officials of the observatory at 105 miles and its distance from the earth is about 100,000,000 miles. Previously the star was calculated to be 11,000 miles in diameter and 100,000,000 miles from the earth. The discovery of the star resulted from a misplaced photograph, about the size of an ordinary mark in a business check book. The misplaced photograph, which is about 1/100,000,000 of an inch in diameter, was discovered by a group of astronomers at the Royal Observatory, Greenwich, England.
