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HON. WALTER SCOTT BURIED AT VICTORIA

Death Investigation Is Continuing.

VICTORIA, March 31.—(CP)—Representatives of two provincial governments today attended the funeral here of Hon. Walter Scott, first premier of Saskatchewan, who died last Wednesday in Guelph, Ont.

Even as Mr. Scott was buried, preparations went ahead in Toronto for an inquest into the death of the former premier.

Conant, Ontario attorney-general, directed that Dr. Smirke Lawson, Toronto chief coroner and supervising coroner for Ontario, preside over the enquiry.

The funeral was held from First United Church here, Hon. G. M. Fyfe, provincial secretary, represented the British Columbia Government, and Saskatchewan was represented by G. B. Johnson, a former member of the Saskatchewan Legislature.

Mr. Scott's body arrived here earlier in the day. It was brought to the coast by Mr. and Mrs. Scott, who arrived here with Miss Dorothy Scott, daughter of the former Saskatchewan premier.

HOME BUILDING INCREASE HERE

Figures Lower Than 1937.

Encouraged by freezing loans under the Dominion Housing Act, Vancouver citizens started construction of 118 more houses during the first three months of 1938 than in the corresponding period last year.

Total value of dwelling permits issued during the three-month period was \$773,530, as compared with \$481,300 in 1937.

SHARP DECREASE

General construction in the city, however, is sharply lower all building permits totalling \$1,378,495 for the first quarter this year against \$2,116,700 in the first quarter last year.

The drop is explained by the fact that three large permits were issued early last year for a total of more than \$1,000,000. They were: First avenue viaduct, \$700,000; a grain elevator, \$647,000; and the Royal Canadian Air Force hangars, \$220,000.
