First of Jap Fishing Boats Sold This Week

Between 25 and 30 Vessels of Seized Fleet Taken Over by Navy and Air Force to Be Used in Patrol Work

By DON MASON — First sales of vessels from the impounded British Columbia Jap fishboat fleet to white buyers were approved by the Japanese Fishing Fleet Disposal Committee and completed this week.

Fifty-seven of the seized boats have been released to date... some sold to white fishermen, some handed back to white owners who had chartered them to Japs before the Pacific war started, and between 25 and 30 taken over by the navy and air force.

Agriculturalists To Meet Here Saturday

Federation Will Discuss Labor Shortage, Post-War Scene, Parity Prices

Three major farm problems—the farm labor shortage, post-war rehabilitation and parity prices—will be discussed at the seventh annual meeting of the B. C. Federation of Agriculture, in Hotel Georgia here, on Saturday, starting at 10 a.m.

The problems are the most important of a list of between 25 and 30 resolutions to be considered by delegates who come from all parts of British Columbia.

E. J. Chambers, president, will preside, and in attendance will be W. J. Manson, Hatzie, and E. D. Barrow, Sardis, Chilliwack, directors. C. A. Hayden, Vernon, is secretary.

Mayor Cornett will officially welcome delegates at 10:30 a.m. and he will be followed by addresses by Dr. G. M. Shrum and Dean F. M. Clement, both of the University of B.C., at the morning session.

Hon. K. C. MacDonald, Provincial Minister of Agriculture, will speak at 2:30 p.m. and Raymond Miller of Los Angeles, head of Agricultural Trade Inc., will address the meeting at 4 p.m.

Vanguard of delegates have already arrived. They include: George Barrett (chairman), Percy French, Vernon, and C. J. Huddleston, Summerland, of the B. C. Tree Fruit Board; A. J. Desbrisay, president, B.C. Fruit Growers' Association; R. B. Hommershawn, Baylegh Mount, representing the Interior Vegetable Marketing Board; William Harrison, Pritchard, president, B.C. Sheep Breeders' Association; H. Coast Growers; Ralph Chetwynd, C. Oldfield, Royal Oak, B.C. Cariboo Livestock Exchange; P. LaGuen, Vernon, of Vernon Fruit Union, and Capt. Claude Taylor, of Kelowna Growers' Exchange.

Western Grocers Profit \$291,000

WINNIPEG, Feb. 13. — Net profit of Western Grocers, Ltd., in 1941, including dividends from subsidiary companies, totalled \$291,992 compared with \$269,634 in 1940, it is disclosed in the 29th annual financial statement released Thursday.

The report shows preferred dividends paid during 1941 totalled \$83,601, and dividends on common shares totalled \$67,772. The earned surplus was \$396,588 at the end of 1941 compared with \$855,979 a year ago. Working capital is reported at \$1,584,654 compared with \$1,195,581 the previous year.
