Salmon Price Held At 1941 Levels

QITAWA, April 18.—The Wartime Prices and Trade Board has announced on behalf of A. Neil McLean, fish products administrator, that although fresh salmon is a seasonal product and supplies of it vary from time to time, the price will not be allowed to increase over that of 1941.

The order stipulates that no processor, wholesaler or retailer will be allowed to sell any fresh caught salmon at a price greater than that obtained by him in the corresponding month of 1941 for the same kind, brand, grade or quality of product.

Vancouver fish dealers will not hazard any guess on the effect of the new order on prices of salmon to the consumer.

About a month ago the Wartime Prices Board set an arbitrary price on red and white spring salmon caught on the west coast of Vancouver Island, chief source of supply. Two weeks ago a further order set a price for fish from other areas at two cents a pound less than west coast fish.

It is claimed that there has not been much advance over 1941 prices.

RUSSIAN AID INCREASED. WASHINGTON, April 18.—The White House today reported a sharp upsurge of Lend-Lease aid to Russia, saying that two and a half times as much was sent in March as was sent in February.

Fix Ontario Beet Prices. TORONTO, April 18.—Ontario Farm Products Control Board's order, setting the price of sugar beets for this year, has been approved by the Wartime Prices and Trade Board.

In making the announcement, G. F. Perkin, chairman of the Ontario Board, issued an appeal to the growers to plant up to 40,000 acres this year to help meet the sugar shortage in Canada.

Under the board's order, issued two weeks ago, the price of 16 percent sugar content beets delivered at the factory is set at \$8.20 a ton, an increase of \$1.30 a ton above the prevailing price in 1941. Prices for other grades are up in proportion.

One provision in the order is that the growers are to participate in any increase in the price of sugar, dried beet pulp or molasses over the present levels.

Last year the acreage dropped to 28,000 from the 38,000 planted in 1940, the reduction being precipitated by a cut in price.
