

TWENTY-NINE AIRMEN NAMED

Killed, Missing, Injured and Ill Included in Latest Casualty List

OTTAWA, April 29 (CP). — The stepped-up tempo of British air operations was reflected today in the 251st Royal Canadian Air Force casualty list of the war, reporting one man killed on active service overseas, fourteen missing after overseas air operations and one missing on active service overseas. The list also gave the names of four men killed on active service in Canada.

Three men previously reported missing overseas were listed as "now for official purposes presumed dead"; one man was listed as seriously ill overseas; one as dead from natural causes in Canada, one as seriously injured in Canada and one as seriously ill in Canada. Following is the latest list of casualties:

OVER FIVE HUNDRED FISHING BOATS SOLD

OTTAWA, April 29 (CP).—Fishing boats taken from the Japanese in British Columbia number 1,140, it was reported in a return made in the House of Commons today for Tom Reid (Liberal, New Westminster).

To date 510 of the boats have been sold. About 15 per cent of those seized are subject to liens or mortgages, but none have been released to individuals or companies because of these claims.

A breakdown of the boats seized showed: Seiners, 62; trollers, 121; gill netters, 718; packers, 144, and miscellaneous, 95.

CLARIFIES RULE OF EMPLOYMENT

Regulations Covering "Help Wanted" Advertisements Explained by Deputy Labor Minister

OTTAWA, April 29 (CP).—Regulations covering "help wanted" advertisements were clarified today in an explanation given by Dr. Bryce Stewart, deputy labor minister.

Dr. Stewart told The Canadian Press that employers would be deemed to comply with regulations prohibiting the enticement of employees from war industries if at the head of the column containing the advertisement there appears the following words:

"Applications will not be considered from persons in the employment of any firm, corporation or other employer engaged in the production of munitions, war equipment or supplies for the armed forces unless such a person is a skilled tradesman not actually employed at his trade."

CONVICTION REGISTERED
At Trail, B.C., George Brooks, employment agent for Pacific Mills, Ltd., of Ocean Falls, B.C., was convicted last week of unlawful advertising and was fined \$10 and costs. The charge followed publication of an advertisement, for the purpose of employing men, from which the restrictive phrase was omitted.

The order in council under which offers of employment are restricted provides that the explanatory clause quoted by Dr. Stewart must appear "in clear type in any such advertisement, letter, circular, notice, poster placard or other writing or document." Dr. Stewart said, however, that insertion of the clause at the head of a column of employment advertisements will be considered sufficient.

The order also prohibits oral solicitation directly or indirectly of any person engaged in war production.
